To a Sick Girl.

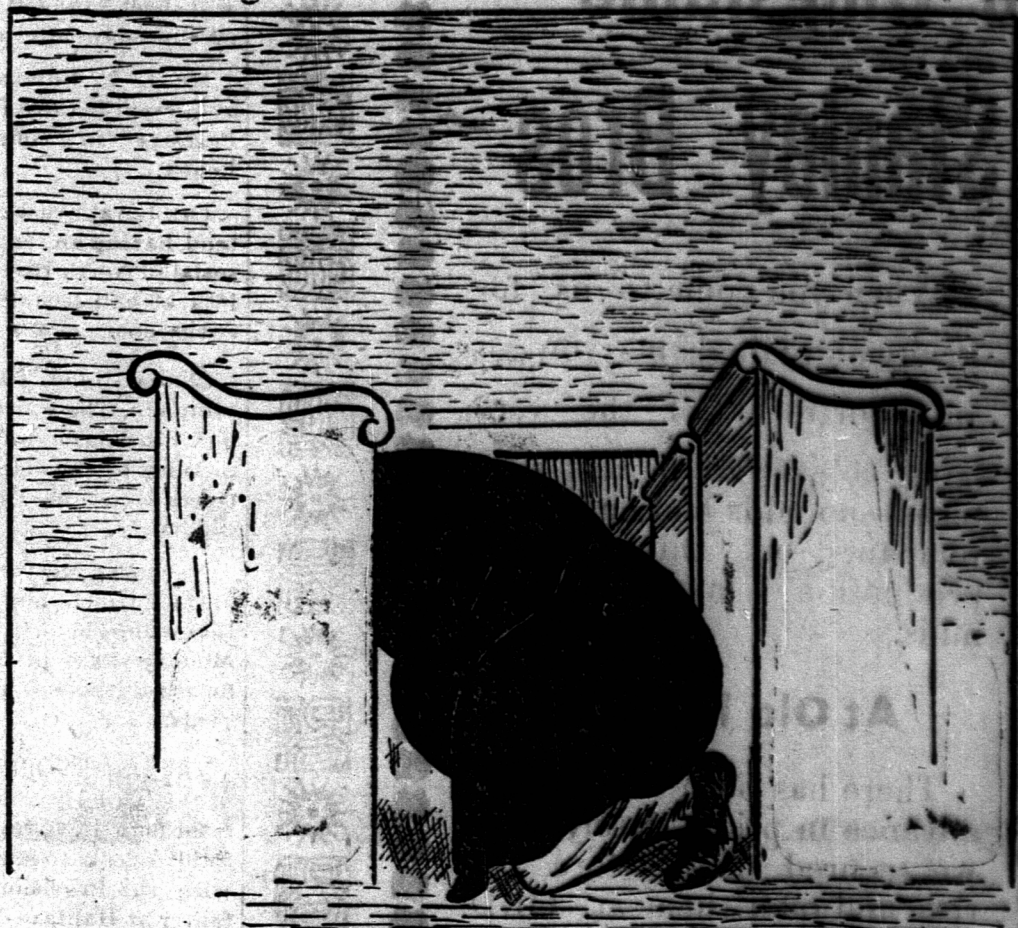
A snowy bed—a weary head Upon a pillow, pallid, Now I will write for her delight A pretty little ballad:
