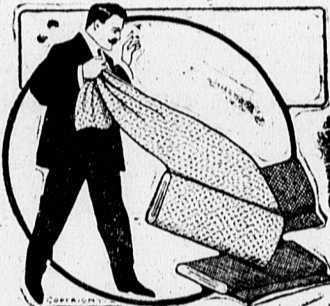

## MONTREAL IS STORM BOUND

MONTREAL, November 22—Montreal was today badly storm-bound, to such an extent that ordinary business was almost tied up during the afternoon. A morning snow storm was succeeded by heavy rain in the afternoon, which stayed on the streets, as the drains were clogged with snow. As a result most of the streets were several inches deep in mud and water, making walking almost impossible. The storm was so severe that telegraph lines were interfered with, and the afternoon papers came out shy on market reports.

## ATTEMPT ON THE LIFE OF BARON ROTHSCHILD

BRESLAU, Prussia, Nov 22—What appears to have been an attempt upon the life of Baron Albert Rothschild, of Vienna, is reported from Schillersdorf, the Rothschild hunting seat in Upper Silesia. Schoolmaster who was on the Schillersdorf was stopped by a man who courteously requested him to deliver a letter to the Baron. The schoolmaster consented and had continued on his way when the letter exploded frightfully, injuring the bearer.

## FREE SPEECH EDITOR GETS LIGHT SENTENCE.

ST. JOHN, Nov. 23.—Bruce McDougall, editor of Free Speech, was this forenoon sentenced to eight months imprisonment, of which he has already served two months.

## ROYALISTS IN FRANCE TO UNITE WITH CATHOLICS.

PARIS, Nov. 22.—The Royalists to-day issued a manifesto announcing their intention to unite with the Catholics at the coming general election in opposition to those candidates who were not in sympathy with the Church's attitude regarding the public schools.

## TWO CRATERS ARE BELCHING FORTH STREAMS OF LAVA.

TENERIFFE, Nov. 23.—Another earthquake shock was felt here yesterday, and its violence increased. Two active craters are belching forth flames to a height of 1,500 feet. The lava flow, however, is not so rapid as a few days ago and there is no immediate danger to villages.

## MORE TUNNEL TALK.

OTTAWA, Nov. 23—Replying to Messrs Warburton, Richards and Fraser, who urgently pressed for action toward the construction of a tunnel, Mr. Fielding agreed that it was "high time it was taken up seriously and the Government would certainly undertake the work, if it was shown that the tunnel could be constructed at moderate cost."

## WINTER WHEAT ACREAGE.

CHICAGO, Nov 22.—Indications are that winter wheat acreage just sown may be about 15 percent greater than last year, when 27,315,000 acres were harvested. At that rate the full acreage for 1909-10 would approximate 31,400,000 acres. The largest previous acreage was that of 1908 of 30,335,000 acres. Ten years before it was 25,745,000 acres, and in 1888 the country's winter wheat acreage was 23,950,000 acres.

## SIGNS OF PROSPERITY.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—One of the clearest evidences of general prosperity is the flotation of new development enterprises,—industrial, railroad or public service. For two years the development of water power companies throughout the United States was practically at a standstill. It is estimated by electrical experts that at the present time, however, plans have been prepared or work is in course on 200,000 horse power of new electrical water power in the West alone, involving over \$20,000,000 of construction.

## THE HOPE DIAMOND SAFE.

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—Contrary to reports the famous Hope Diamond did not go down in the wreck of the "Seymour" at Singapore, but is now in possession of a Paris Jeweler named Roseneau, if a cablegram from the French capital is to be credited. It seems that the jewel was offered for sale by Selim Habib last June, but was withdrawn. Subsequently it was bought by Roseneau, who has confessed rather ruefully that it is still in his possession.

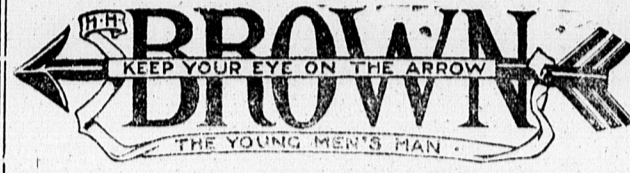

MORE AEROPLANE RECORDS.  
BOUY, FRANCE, Nov. 22.—Competing for the Weiller height prize for heavier-than-air machines, Hubert Latham to-day in a monoplane ascended a distance of 1,345 feet, and M. Paulhan, in a biplane, 1,181 feet. Both these heights are world's records. Paulhan previously held the honor at 997 feet, the flight having been made at Sandown, England. Orville Wright made an unofficial flight at a height of 1,600 feet at Potsdam in October, and Count de Lambert is credited with having reached a height of 1,300 feet when he passed over the Eiffel tower. This latter feat also was unofficial.
