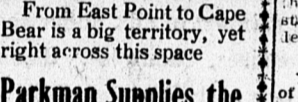

Summerside Cuts Out Minimum Charge For Electricity

There was a good deal of discussion at the regular meeting of the Summerside Town Council on Monday evening over the charge for electric light and the condition of the lighting provided. Councillor Allen was the principal speaker and went into these matters pretty fully. He explained, in reference to the dimness of the lights, regarding which complaint had been made, that there were several reasons for this, and made special reference to an overloaded transformer on Water Street which had since been replaced and that trouble because of the oil which had been taken over from the preceding company and the use of which had also since been discontinued. There were several other matters which had a bearing on the trouble and which had also been remedied. Following Council Allen's explanation a resolution was unanimously adopted fixing the charges and discounts for electricity sold by the Town as follows:

To customers using current to the value of \$1.00 and less per month, 20c per 1,000 watts net.

To customers using current from \$1.00 to \$10.00 per month, 20c, less 10 per cent discount.

To customers using current from \$10.00 to \$100.00 per month, 20c, less 15 per cent discount.

To customers using current to the value of \$100.00 and over per month 20c, less 20 per cent. Meter rental 25c per month net.

All these charges are to be payable the 10th of each month and whenever a customer is over two months in arrears the light will be discontinued without notice.

The matter of several thefts in the Town and no action being taken by the officers of the law, was also dealt with at length, and Council Allen was instructed to look into these matters with a view to seeing that the guilty parties are punished, when they are known.

Mr. George P. Grady and Philias Gallant made applications for permission to operate billiard rooms in the town, were given permission to do so upon complying with the usual conditions.

Several bills were passed and other routine business was transacted after which the meeting adjourned to assemble again before Christmas.

The committee appointed by the Summerside Board of Trade to consider the proposed telephone rates submitted by the Telephone Co., of P. E. I. have written the company requesting knowledge of what improvements the company proposed if an increase in rates is to be considered. It is understood the committee is working on the schedule of rates the company submitted in June, which is considerably below the schedule recently submitted. The following shows the present Summerside rates, the schedule submitted in June and the newer schedule the company submitted a few days ago:
