Italy Celebrating Tripoli Occupation

ROME, Italy, December 15.—Benito Mussolini went to jail for a year in 1901 for his opposition to the Italian occupation of Tripoli—but the Italian nation, under his leadership, is now celebrating the twentieth anniversary of that occupation.

Italy's seizure of the colony from the Turks provoked such violent attacks from Mussolini that he was arrested, tried and convicted. He delivered a long speech to the judges, saying, "If you convict me you do me honor because you cannot find me a malefactor but an assessor of ideas, and agitator of conscience, a soldier of a faith that imposes respect from you, because it carries with it the prophecy of the future and the great force of truth."

"Today the Italian newspapers do not refer to that imprisonment. They speak, instead, of the Italian Empire II Duce is struggling successfully to build up. And they are on safe ground, for Fascist Italy has really worked wonders in Tripoli."

In the city of Tripoli a modern harbor for big ocean liners, a new cathedral in the midst of the old atmosphere. Outside the city green fields instead of trenches. Modern roads running along the coast and into the interior, almonds, olives, vineyards, fruit, instead of barren sand. Overhead a big seaplane winging its way on scheduled time to Syracuse, Sicily, and Ostia, near Rome.

On the twentieth anniversary of her occupation, Italy has consolidated her North African possessions by extensive military operation against "rebels" in the hinterland of Tripolitania and Cirenaica.

Author Reveals Modern Way To Visit South Seas

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, N. Y., Dec. 15 As the new novel on which he has been working for the last six months is finished, Peter B. Kyne, well known novelist, will soon be off for the South Seas. But not to get away from it all, as so many famous people have done since the dubious delights of some of these tropic isles have never described by writers who have never visited them.

The novelist is going to the South Seas on the newest and most luxurious Pacific liner. For he has no illusions about the attractions of the Polynesian spots where polyan-dry and polygamy are the principal outdoor sports. In fact he is even taking his wife with him.

Unlike many writers, the author of "Cappy Ricks" and a score of other tales does not seek a secluded or pseudo romantic spot. When he has a book to complete he leaves his San Francisco apartment and takes a suite in a New York hotel, where he remains until the manuscript is completed. In the present instance he has been at work in an upper Broadway hotel since June. And while he does not recommend his "system" to others he finds it highly successful.

There was a time when Mr. Kyne wanted to charter a schooner and sail for the South Seas in the approved story book fashion. Some years ago he was anxious to visit Christmas Island, some 900 miles south of Hawaii, to spend a month with a former French priest who has kept a daily journal of his experiences in that part of the world for more than fifty years. The novelist felt there might be a great story in the ex-priest's diary.

However, the visits to San Francisco of various traders from the South Seas—the spars of their schooners can be glimpsed from his apartment on one of the hills overlooking the Golden Gate—have destroyed most of his illusions. He still hopes to get the ex-priest's diary. For when he learned that one of the leading residents of that un-desired spot in that part of the world—an island where communal societies still prevail—had come up to San Francisco to buy a sewing machine for his wife and a cocktail shaker for himself he began to have some doubts about settling down among them. And when he discovered that he had brought a lot of copra bugs to his apartment as the result of his visit to a South Sea schooner he decided that when he went to that part of the world he would take the largest and most expensive liner he could find.

Trek To Alaska Aim Of Woman

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., December 15.—Mrs. Edward M. Biddle, prominent society woman of this city, has disclosed her intention of making a lone trek into central Alaska to study customs and living conditions of native women for six months this winter. The trip, she said, has been her cherished ambition since her girlhood reading of Arctic explorations. She is now in New York completing purchases of supplies. Her three children will remain here.

Reticent as to the exact nature of her sociological study, Mrs. Biddle said she planned to make her observations the basis of a book she hopes to write on her return. She will carry two guns, a sleeping bag and two suitcases with cameras and photographic equipment. While she is considered an experienced hunter, she has never before travelled in such wild country, she said. In Alaska she will wear the hooded fur jacket, trousers and mukluk of the Eskimo.

Mrs. Biddle said she expects to go first to Seattle. From there she will go by boat to Seward, Alaska, thence by train 500 miles northward into the interior and the last 500 miles by dog sled to the environs of Nenana on the Yukon.

Vilhjalmar Stefansson, well known Arctic explorer and Dr. Gaston Burke, medical missionary to Fort Yukon, she said, have assisted her with plans for the trip.
