BOSTON July 2-(CP)-Due in part to light passenger train service between Montreal and Maine coastal communities was cancelled last night for the balance of the summer.

MONTREAL, July 2-(CP)-Officials of the Quebec division of the Canadian Red Cross Society announced today that they have received for the purchase of 25 ambulances for the British Red Cross Society and pledges for at least eight more.

Canadians resident in the United States who find themselves visiting in Canada without having procured re-entry permits are, however, in a slightly awkward situation. It will be necessary, it was explained at the United States consulate, for them to obtain new visas for entry. It has not yet been decided whether they will require passports.

JEHOVAH'S WITNESS SENTENCED ST. STEPHEN, N. B. July 2-(CP) - Gilbert V. Racicot, member of a religious sect (Jehovah's Witnesses), was sentenced today to four months in jail for distributing subversive literature.

CONDITION IMPROVES OTTAWA, July 2-(CP) - The naval vice tonight reported the improvement in the condition of A. B. Roberts, of the Prince Edward Island, survivor of the sinking of the M.C.S. Fraser. Roberts was reported seriously injured at the Royal Naval Hospital at Plymouth, England.

NO-WELCOME FINE OXFORD, England-(CP) - Kurt Albert Jellinek, 21-year-old undergraduate son of a former professor of the University of Vienna, was fined £50 (\$222) for trying to get into a lecture restricted to Officers' Training Corps members.
