MINISTERS TO ATTEND CONVENTION OF LOCOMOTIVE ENGINEERS.

HALIFAX, July 16.—When the Right Hon. Prime Minister, Sir Robert Borden, was in Halifax a few days ago a delegation of the locomotive engineers gave him a pressing invitation to attend the great gathering, which will assemble in Halifax on July 20th, four thousand strong. The Premier promised the men that if at all possible he would be present.

The Prime Minister now finds it because of important government business he cannot accept the invitation of the delegation to come to Halifax on this occasion to meet the men and make their acquaintance, but Hon. T. W. Crothers, Minister of Labor, and Hon. J. D. Hazen have accepted the invitation of the railway men and will be present during the convention. The gathering will be the greatest in point of attendance and in importance of the business represented that has ever assembled in Halifax, and this will be recognized in the presence of two members of the Dominion cabinet.

HINDUS MAY GO TO HALIFAX.

VANCOUVER, July 14.—Negotiations are now being carried on by an East Indian, styling himself Behari Lal Verma, as secretary of the American Indian Colonization Company, with Towner, Jones and Company, of Bombay, for a vessel capable of carrying five hundred third class Hindus via the Suez Canal to Halifax, Verma, failed in chartering a boat in Hong Kong for the same purpose. The protector of emigrants, the Government official in Bombay, has not yet agreed to issue permits for the proposed five hundred emigrants to Canada. A call for four hundred volunteers among the Hindu residents of Canada, to go to India about the time the Komagata Maru sails back and to preach sedition there with the Maru passengers, is now being issued here. Hindus have also gone East, in order it is said, to get into the United States there and come West to the Pacific Coast States and raise additional volunteers there to make the total number 1,000.

WORLD'S BIGGEST GUN FOR PANAMA.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—When its breach locking device has been perfected at Watervliet arsenal, the great 16 inch gun, the biggest piece of ordnance in the world which has just been shipped from Sandy Hook proving grounds, will be practically ready for service on the Panama canal fortifications. Some idea may be obtained of the tremendous power of this gun, destined to protect the Pacific entrance to the Panama canal, by the fact that it is fifty feet long, weighs 142 tons and fires a projectile about six feet long. The projectile itself weighs a ton and is discharged by 665 pounds of powder. It requires eight men to carry the powder charge. This gun has a maximum range of from 22 to 23 miles. The elevation permitted by its carriage will enable the gun to fire a projectile about 11 miles across the Pacific ocean. It has sufficient power, theoretically to pierce two feet of the best armor at the muzzle. At 11 miles the gun is calculated to pierce a 12 inch armor plate or any side armor afloat. Army ordnance officials believe this gun will be a tremendous instrument of peace when it is finally in position on the Panama canal.
