SECRETARY LOU MACMILLAN SAYS CANADIAN UNION HAS FAILED TO KEEP PROMISES

M.P.B.A.A.U.C. Executive Sends Officials Copy of Article of Alliance Between M. P. B. and C. A. A. U.—Says Parent Failed to Live up to Agreement.

Secretary Louis B. MacMillan of the M.P.B.A.A.U.C. has sent the following to members of the executive of the M.P.B.:

Owing to recent publications in the Press, I deem it my duty as your Secretary to make certain explanations.

At the last special meeting held in Amherst on Oct. 14th last the following resolution was passed:

"That this meeting go on record as being opposed to secession from the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada so long as they receive fair treatment from the parent body, also that the meeting is opposed to secession from the Maritime Branch."

I have endeavored to carry on the affairs of the branch in accordance with its constitution and have tried to live up to the articles of affiliation with the A.A.U. of C. which were entered into with them in November 1909, the full meaning and intention of which I am quite familiar with as, at that time, I had the honour to be your Secretary.

During the past winter certain cards were issued to men which, I deem, was within my authority. One of our executive differed, but the majority carried and the dissenting member saw fit to report the matter to the A.A.U. of C. instead of to you. The Officers of the Union asked me for a report on this matter and this I absolutely refused to give as it is a matter of branch importance and all matters of branch importance I consider should be dealt with by the Branch itself.

I have no intention of deviating in the least from this stand as I am absolutely confident that I am right and that my duty lies first to you, while I have nothing personal to do in the matter yet, as long as I am your officer I shall stand by your rights in the face of all opposition, and you alone shall decide the issue.

I may say for your information that a threat has been issued to suspend the Branch. To this I give no attention as your Branch existed before the Union and, I hope, will carry on long after the other has ceased to exist. While I am strongly in favor of Canada being a member of the C.A.A.U. and the C.A.A.U. Union, that union must extend from Halifax to Vancouver.

and be administered with that view, and not sectional.

Broken Agreement

Not only has the A.A.U. of C. failed a live up to our affiliation contract but they have flagrantly violated their own constitution and have adopted a method of back door administration in dealing with the Maritimes that is no credit to them.

I have asked President Doyle to name a date for the semi-annual meeting and he has promised to do so in a few days of which due notice will be given to all affiliated clubs. At that meeting you will get a full report of all my actions and you can decide what course to pursue.

The constitution of the Branch as it now stands is absolutely unsuited for proper administration, and it will be necessary to consider amendments along the lines of compulsory larger representation on the executive from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick as well as having the intercollegiate union, the baseball and hockey association represented thereon.

The executive has seen fit to cancel the appointment of acting Vice-President Mr. Blakeney, of Moncton, who has been temporarily filling the position made vacant by the resignation of W. E. Sterling of St. John.

The articles of alliance between the M. P. B. and C. A. A. U. are: 1.—At all meetings of the Canadian Amateur Athletic Union the Maritime Provinces Amateur Athletic Association shall be entitled to representation by not more than six delegates, or duly elected alternates of such delegates, having each one vote. 2.—From among these delegates three shall be chosen to become members of the Board of Governors of the Canadian Amateur Athletic Union, who shall have vote and privilege equal to other members of said Board on all matters coming before it. 3.—The M.P.A.A.A. recognizes the C.A.A.U. as the governing body of amateur sport throughout Canada. 4.—The C.A.A.U. delegates to the M.P.A.A.A. the full control and jurisdiction over all athletic sports exercises in the Maritime Provinces. 5.—All games or athletic meetings open to amateurs residing or competing in the Maritime Provinces, shall be held under the rules of the M.P.A.A.A., provided the qualifications of all persons competing in such games or meetings shall be in conformity with the conditions of competition prescribed in the constitution, by-laws and rules of the C.A.A.U. 6.—Each party to this alliance agrees to respect and enforce all penalties of suspension and disqualification inflicted by the other party. 7.—The M.P.A.A.A. agrees to pay annually to the C.A.A.U. a sum equal to \$3 for each delegate to which the M.P.A.A.A. is entitled. 8.—The articles of alliance may be terminated by either party upon thirty days' written notice to the other.
