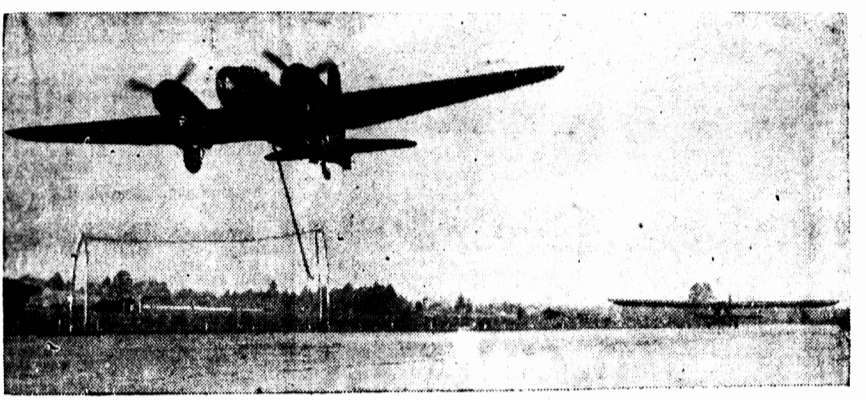

Peacetime Uses of Freight Glider Are Adapted for Carrying Trouble to Axis

RICHARD DU PONT, SOARING HOBBYIST, LANDS AT TOP OF ARMY'S MOTORLESS FLIGHT PROGRAM, SAYS ALLIES BETTERED GERMAN METHODS

WASHINGTON—A young modest and rather shy man named Richard du Pont slipped quietly into the Pentagon Building several weeks ago to take part of the Army's motorless flight program...

His glider experience began when he was 17, and he flew them 10 years. During that time he held the international distance and distance-and-return soaring records, besides establishing a national altitude record and later breaking it. He thought he had given up his youthful hobby when, at the ripe old age of 27, he became president of a new firm called All-American Aviation, Inc. But his activities after he had grounded himself probably had more to do with his getting his present job than did his records as a glider pilot.

FLYING FREIGHT

All-American Aviation was organized to operate and develop one of Du Pont's brain children—the air mail pickup system. That is the clever and efficient scheme whereby mail is snatched up in a plane in flight, at a considerable saving of time, space and expense. It includes freight pickups.

Shippers liked this freight idea and wanted to include larger and heavier packages. Finally things reached a point where Du Pont decided that the only way they get this heavy freight off the ground would be to put wings on it. So he found himself right back in the glider business.

In Memoriam

MR. GEORGE TAYLOR

Many friends were both shocked and saddened when it became known that George Taylor had suddenly passed to his eternal home at his late residence in Hamilton the age of 82 years. The deceased was a life long resident of Hamilton and was the son of the late Alexander and Mrs. Taylor. He was an industrious and prosperous farmer till his health began to fail and he disposed of his farm and moved to Upper Hamilton. He was a citizen of high standing in the community where he was known for his many fine Christian principles. His funeral was held on Saturday afternoon and was largely attended by many friends from far and near who came to pay their last tribute of respect of loving sympathy. The service was conducted by Rev. Mr. Crowdis; after a short service at the home it was continued in the United Church at Malpeque. Rev. Mr. Crowdis gave a comforting and helpful message from 1 Timothy 6-17 on the value of gaining an eternal inheritance in the life of the deceased. The hymns sung were Forever With the Lord, The Lord's My Shepherd and Abide With Me. When the benediction was pronounced a large number of old friends viewed the remains of a much loved friend.

GLIDERS FLY BLIND "We've gone ahead of the Germans in glider development," said Du Pont, "in spite of their many years of pioneering activity in this field. We are not only able to retrieve gliders after they have landed, which the Germans aren't, but we have also equipped our gliders for blind flying."

The fate of the German 120-place Messerschmitt gliders, converted to six-motor transports, which Allied fliers shot down over the Mediterranean during the Tunisian campaign, indicated to Du Pont that the Nazi glider program has run into trouble.

"Perhaps they couldn't get anything big enough to tow them," he said. "At any rate they sacrificed pay load for engines and fuel and made them fire trans. And with six motors on them, they couldn't have been very expendable."
