### Control Of Willow Blight

(Experimental Farms Notes) Willow blight has been universally destructive in Eastern Canada but can be controlled where the ornamental or historical value of the trees warrants the necessary expenditure of time and money. In the Grand Pre Memorial Park where the willows have been sprayed for six years following the recommendations of the Dominion Laboratory of Plant Pathology, Kentville, N. S., practical control of the blight has been obtained. Applications of Bordeaux, spaced at 14-day intervals. The first application must be made during the critical period just after the catkins have come out and while the leaves are still in the mouse ear stage, for, if the fungus once becomes established on the young leaves, subsequent spraying has little or no effect.

The principal difficulties in controlling willow blight are physical. The trees are usually so large that it is impossible to spray the top branches. In the Annapolis and Cornwallis Valleys, power sprayers and spray guns are readily available and moderate sized trees can be covered properly. On very tall old trees such as those at Grand Pre it has been necessary to use a solid stream spray gun aimed at the tops of the largest trees.

The Bordeaux mixture is the 8-24-100 which is made up of 3 pounds of bluestone dissolved in 100 gallons of water and 24 pounds of hydrated lime added while stirring the solution vigorously. If ground lime is not available the formula 10-10-100 should be followed. The 10 pounds of bluestone are dissolved and 10 pounds of fresh stone lime slaked separately. The bluestone solution is added to the water and then the lime solution.

Pruning has proved of value but must be done while the trees are dormant. It has controlled the disease on hedges which were cut back closely each winter. On large trees the dead wood should be removed during the fall and winter, and when desirable, the trees can be headed back at the same time.

### Plan to Improve Old Fort Howe At Saint John

SAINT JOHN, N. B., April 23—(C.P.)—Plans for the improvement of Historic Fort Howe, as submitted by the department of national defence, have been approved by the Commission Council of Saint John on condition they are carried out without cost to the city.

The proposal includes construction of a semi-circular stone battery, placement of six old cannon, paving of a parking space for automobiles and paving of the foot-path leading to the flagstaff. The stone battery

on the brow of Fort Howe, overlooking the city, would be 150 feet long and four feet high.

Dr. J. Clarence Webster, C.M.G., New Brunswick historian, says in a reference to the fort:

After the destruction of Fort Frederick by the Americans in 1775, the English residents on the St. John river became alarmed and appealed to the authorities in Halifax for protection. The anxiety became greater when various raids followed and when an American force under Jonathan Eddy attempted to capture Fort Cumberland in Chignecto.

"Several war vessels were sent to cruise in the Bay of Fundy, but as these were ineffectual for land defence, fresh appeals were made and a body of troops, under Major Gifford Studholme, were sent to Saint John in 1778, with orders to rebuild Fort Frederick or to build a new fort. The latter course was adopted and on the large hill above Portland Point, Studholme erected Fort Howe and two block houses. The hill has ever since been known as Fort Howe Hill. It was abandoned as a military post in 1821.

At the present day all traces of the fort have disappeared. A signal staff has been erected in modern times near its site, and nearby, in an old well which was used by the garrison. It is interesting to note that after the fort was built, the guns never fired. In 1929 the government of Canada built a fine road to near the top of the hill, to be known as the Studholme Drive. A massive stone monument in his memory of Major Studholme has also been erected by the Historic Sites and Monument Board, on the site of the old fort."
