FINANCIAL STANDING OF PRESBYTERIAN AND METHODIST CHURCHES.

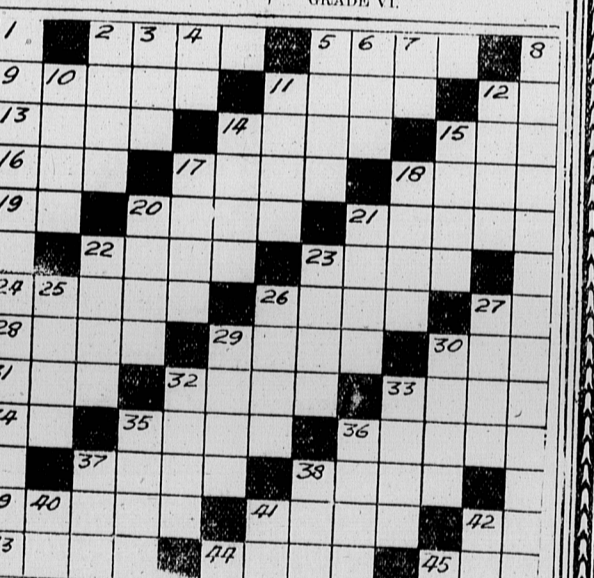
