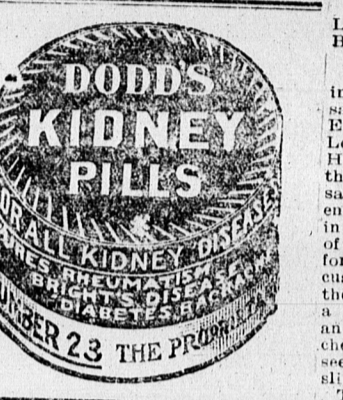

Government Policy Won When Score of Conservative Peers Voted For Measure

LONDON, Aug. 11.—The Asquith Government, which claims to represent the democracy of Great Britain, last night enforced its will upon the peerage by the narrow vote of 111 to 114. By this vote the House of Lords decided to accept what the Liberals contend is the will of the people, and adopted Viscount Morley's motion to insist upon the Lords' amendments to the parliamentary bill, which practically limits the power of the House to a two-years' suspensory veto and vastly increases the prerogatives of the House of Commons.

had anticipated, and the Government owes its victory to the votes of between twenty and thirty Conservatives, who threw in their lot with the Liberals to save their own caste from the loss of prestige by a great increase in its numbers and the King from the necessity of the exercise of the royal prerogative, from which everyone believes he was most anxious to be saved.

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York and nine bishops, although the ecclesiastical lords generally keep aloof from party questions. The Bishops of Bangor and Worcester went with the Haisburyites, 'the last ditchers.' It was noticeable that the highest ranks of the nobility furnished the fewest supporters of the Government. The Dukes of Norfolk, Leeds, Marlborough, Newcastle, Northumberland, Somerset and Westminster, voted with the Opposition, while the remainder abstained from voting.

LORDS BECOME BOISTEROUS.

Lieut.-Col. Arthur Lee, in speaking in the House of Commons today, said this would be a black day in England's history if the House of Lords accepted the veto bill and the House of Commons cut adrift from the trading centuries to bestow salaries upon its members. Apparently the sentiment of the peers was in full accord with this description of the occasion. Lords frequently forgot the oppressive dignity which customarily marks the proceedings in the Upper Chamber and fought for a hearing with the strenuousness of an American Congressman who has cherished a public building bill and sees the last hours of the session slipping past.

The Earl of Halsbury once went so far as to make a formal motion that one of his supporters be heard in preference to one peer who favored the Government.

When the voting began Lord Lansdowne withdrew to a position behind the throne, but his followers watched the issue eagerly. The bishops on both sides walked through the tellers first. A thrill of excitement marked the appearance of each notable, but none was greater than when Lord Rosebery appeared as a supporter of the Government.

As soon as the result was known, several members of the House of Commons went into their own chamber and into their own chamber and whispered the news to the members. A great cheer followed the announcement of the Government's victory.

day, Lord Morley, speaking for the Government, announced that if the measure were defeated the King had assented to the creation of sufficient peers to guard against any possible combination of the different opposition parties by which the bill might be exposed a second time to defeat. He read this slowly from a sheet of foolscap. He said that the matter deserved an answer plain, deliberate and beyond all cavil and mistake. He concluded: "Every vote against this motion not to insist on the amendments is a vote given in favor of a large and prompt creation of peers."

Lord Rosebery, who followed Morley, admitted that it was now quite clear that the bill must pass. The former premier, who spoke for the first time since the Veto Bill was introduced in the Upper House, denounced the Government for having gone to a young and inexperienced king, not yet to the throne, to ask for guarantee of passage of a bill that should not even pass its first reading in the House of Commons.

He concluded: "If the bill passes there will be a dangerous measure of the Government, and the Empire will be spared the sight of a scandal which would go far to weaken the hold of the centre of the Empire on its component parts."
