**INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION.**

At Lake Mohonk, New York the ninth annual conference on international arbitration was held, and the reports tell of a very interesting sitting. Hon John W. Foster presided and presented a report showing the advance of arbitration as a means for settling troubles between nations. Within the year past seven international controversies have been so referred to special arbitrators or commissions, while five such cases before referred to arbitration have been determined within the year and the award in each instance accepted.

It is now almost a generation since the Alabama Claims were arbitrated between Britain and the United States, in which case the award was heavily against the Mother Country, but the judgement was cheerfully paid. Although the figures were in tens of millions the settlement involved not more than the cost of a few days of a great modern war. That notable arbitration undoubtedly gave an impetus to international arbitration. Since then we have had the Hague tribunal set up as a permanent court for settling troublesome questions, and it has already well justified its creation.

It seems regrettable that the treaty of arbitration negotiated by the late Lord Pauncefoot and Secretary Olney some six years ago was then rejected by the United States Senate. Britain and the Republic ought really to have kept the lead of the world in this matter, and probably would have done so but for the fact that the Alaska boundary dispute was pending, which dispute the Washington party leaders have been all along unwilling to leave to a fair arbitration. We may hope that if the boundary question should now be got out of the way, the rejected treaty for general arbitration between the two countries may be renewed and ratified. Since the Lake Mohonk conference be-

gan its annual sitting word has come across the Atlantic that Britain and France have made a treaty providing for arbitration of all disputes that may hereafter arise between them. It is also to be noted that not long since two South American nations, China, and Argentina, submitted a boundary question, quite as important as the Alaska question, to the arbitration of King Edward, and both parties loyally accepted his decision and proceeded at once to reduce the armed forces they had prepared in expectation of war.

Such are some of the hopeful signs of the times, advancing by slow, but by sure progress toward the era when Christian nations will not make war upon each other until at least all peaceful means of settlement shall have been exhausted. It is now ninety years since Britain and the United States have drawn the sword against each other, and nearly as long since Britain and France have been embroiled in war, although previous to 1815 they were ever ready to fly at each other's throats. And we know that peace thus longer and longer continued tends to increase the ties of friendship and of mutual interest; to obliterate old quarrels and make war more and more repugnant to the conscience of civilized people.
