SANATORIA FOR CONSUMPTIVES.

At the recent meeting of the British Medical Association at Ipswich the above subject was discussed, and the results of the working of sanatoria now in operation were discussed. The opinion was expressed that each county should erect a sanatorium for consumptives with free admission and treatment for all who could not afford to pay, and a moderate charge for the many who would be both able and willing to pay, the balance of cost to be paid out of the county rates. There was a general feeling that the matter should be handled by the civil authorities, and not left to private philanthropy.

In the discussion stress was laid upon the importance of health authorities doing everything in their power to prevent the disease, by directing their attention to the houses and their surroundings of the working classes, and the disinfection of houses in which consumptives have lived and died, with their clothes and bed linen. Dr. Nathan Raw, who read the paper introducing the discussion characterized consumption as "the greatest preventable evil the world has ever known." If so great an evil is preventable, and this seems to be now the conviction of the scientific world, it can be scarcely less than criminal to neglect or delay the use of preventive measures.

It has been found in England that while it requires a certain education of the public mind to lead to the establishment of a sanatorium, when it is once in working it becomes the greatest of educational agencies in the way of preventive measures. One of the speakers said: "Send a patient to a sanatorium for a few months and on his return the patient is sure to inform his friends of the good effects of the treatment and how it is carried out. He helps to teach that consumption is its early stages is curable, and imparts information as to the precautions observed to prevent a patient communicating the disease to those about him." We trust the medical profession and press of Prince Edward Island will unite in keeping the subject in agitation until some practical movement for the prevention and cure of consumption is inaugurated.

Rumor is again busy with the name of Hon. Henry R. Emmerson, Premier of New Brunswick. Probably a majority of his friends desire him to stay where he is and preside over the affairs of the Province. But there is a Supreme Court Judgeship vacant, which is in the line of ambition for Attorneys General, and it is understood that Mr. Emmerson could have the office for the asking. Another rumor has it that Mr. Emmerson will retire from local politics and will not accept the waiting Judgeship but will take a hand in Dominion politics as the Liberal candidate for Westmorland County. If chances of preference are in demand Premier Emmerson would seem to have an embarrassment of riches in that line.

The St. John Globe has a word to say for Mr. Richardson, M. P. for Lisgar Manitoba, where the Liberal party convention has declined to renominate him. Mr. Richardson, who conducts the Tribune newspaper, came in conflict with Hon. Mr. Sifton, and also helped to defeat the Greenway Government. He was too independent for his party leaders. Both parties make the mistake of repressing too severely representative men who while mainly in accord with their leaders yet have sufficient independence to vote against a party measure which they believe to be wrong or injurious. Such men ought to be encouraged by the people they represent.

The Witness' advice to electors to listen to the addresses of the party leaders and candidates and then for the electors to make up their minds calmly as if in the jury box, is sound and commendable.

According to the New York Sun serious trouble has broken out in Rhodesia between the South African Company and the natives. The Sun's information is that 20,000 armed Matabele are holding the mountain range between Bulawayo and the Transvaal frontier, that martial law was proclaimed some months ago, and that the greatest pains have been taken to prevent news of the real situation reaching the outside world. It seems probable that there is some trouble in that quarter, and that Boer intrigue is at the bottom of it. Rhodesia has probably a million native inhabitants with but a handful of Europeans.

The Moncton Times says Senator Ferguson is one of the ablest men in the Upper House, and prints an extended report of his speech before the Tupper Club of that city.

Although our parliamentary term is five years, as compared with the four years term for a President of the United States, our general elections come almost as frequently as the Presidential contests. The first Dominion election was held August 7, 1867. The next was held in July, 1872, the interval being four years and eleven months. The next was in January, 1874, the interval being two years and six months. The next came in September, 1878, or four years and eight months later. Then followed the election of June, 1882, the interval being three years and nine months. The next election in February, 1887 left an interval of four years and eight months. Then after four years and one month came the election of March, 1891, followed by the longer interval of five years and three months before the election of June 1896. If the coming election should take place in October it will be the ninth within a period of thirty-three years and two months.
