If there is any single exhibit at this year's Canadian National Exhibition that will prove to be a hit with visitors, it is that of the Canadian National Grand Trunk Railways. Both from the standpoint of interest that it will excite and the wide knowledge it will disseminate the exhibit is of outstanding importance.

The large circular room at the northwest angle of the building is devoted to one particular purpose; the conveying to visitors a conception of the extent and importance of Canada's "Great National Highway" with its 22,375 miles of steel rails, and an ocular demonstration of the vastness of the country and the rich resources present to each of the nine Provinces of the Dominion.

Appropriately grouped in the centre of the picture between the scenes depicting the Pacific and Atlantic Coasts are large paintings representing each of the nine Provinces. A forest of giant trees depicts the lumbering resources of British Columbia. A vast herd of sheep grazing upon the prairie is a magnificent picture of the resources of Ontario in hydro-electric power.

On the northern wall of the same room are two other important large and interesting pictures. One of these, in natural colors, and about 40 by 10 feet in size, shows Mount Robson, the highest in the Rockies, reaching as it does an altitude of 13,069 feet.
