McBRIDE BUSY IN LONDON TOWN

British Columbia's Prime Minister Urging Claims of His Province

LONDON, May 21—Premier McBride, of British Columbia, spent 17 hours in Paris, and will return to London tomorrow. He expects to remain here two weeks at least. He has had several interviews with Lord Elgin, Mr. Churchill, and the permanent secretary of the Colonial Office, Sir Francis Hopgood. He fully explained British Columbia's claim to exceptional treatment, respecting the federal subsidy. Sir Wilfrid Laurier has also submitted the federal case and the matter is now under official examination.
