SUCCESSFUL CIVIC YEAR

The civic fathers are entitled to account with a deposit of \$358 to meet the storm sewers year as shown by the report of the annual meeting published in yesterday's Guardian. The total receipts for the year were \$147,118.02 as compared with \$121,456.91 the previous year. There was a substantial balance to the credit of the city against the deficit the previous year. A comparison of the years financial statement will show some noteworthy increases and decreases both in receipts and expenditures. The additional tax of one eighth of one per cent on real and personal property accounts for a considerable increase of revenue from these two sources. There was also a slight increase in milk vendors' licenses, Insurance Companies' licenses and in Water and Sewerage taxes. In expenditures there was a considerable increase in the grant for educational purposes, in maintenance of streets, the Board of Health and the Fire Department. The influenza epidemic was accounted for a considerable additional expenditure. A most satisfactory showing is made with reference to the various sinking funds all of which have been placed on a basis calculated to meet the maturity of all the debentures afloat. 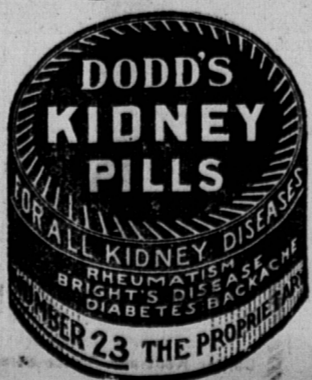
INDUCEMENTS

The population of this province, when our soldiers return, will probably not exceed 90,000. We have room for at least 200,000 and our province will not have reached even approximately the measure of its possibilities until we have at least doubled our present population. How are we to secure this addition? Certainly not by natural increase. There is only one source, namely immigration. Immigration is not an accidental movement of peoples nor is their settlement in any land an accidental or even a providential arrangement. Migration and settlement are simply the natural response to inducement. Without inducement there would be no migration, no movement of peoples. The call of the free lands, the rich forests, the unexplored mines, the fishing grounds, brought our forefathers from the old land which had become congested and stale. And the call is still sounding in the ears of the millions in the old lands of Europe. Every section of America, which is still the "new world" has its special call, its exclusive inducement. In our own Canada the western prairies are beckoning to the old world and offering free farms to those who are willing to put up with the inconveniences incident to unsettled lands. The forests and the mines with their limitless possibilities are holding out inducements for speculation or employment. What inducements is Prince Edward Island holding out? What inducements have we to offer? We have no farms to give away, no mines, no forests, little if any employment to offer. But we have farms to sell, many of them. We
