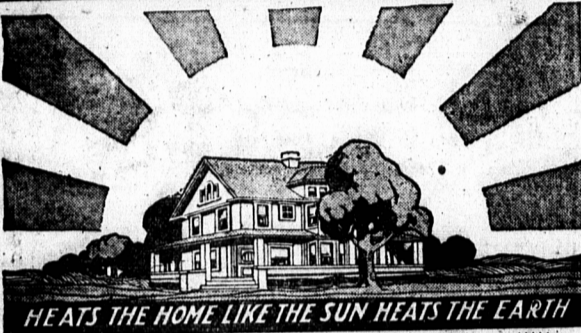

West Virginia To Dedicate Its New \$600,000 Stadium

MORGANTOWN, W. VA., Nov. 15.—With Governor Pinchot of Pennsylvania and Governor Gore of Virginia heading groups of distinguished spectators from two states, West Virginia University will dedicate its new \$600,000 Mountaineer Stadium, November 14, Penn State will oppose West Virginia in the gridiron clash.

The stadium was built from funds contributed by more than 7,300 West Virginians. It is horseshoe shaped and at present will seat 33,000. Erection of an upper tier would increase the seating capacity to 50,000 and the building of another section at the end would make the capacity 75,000 or 80,000.
