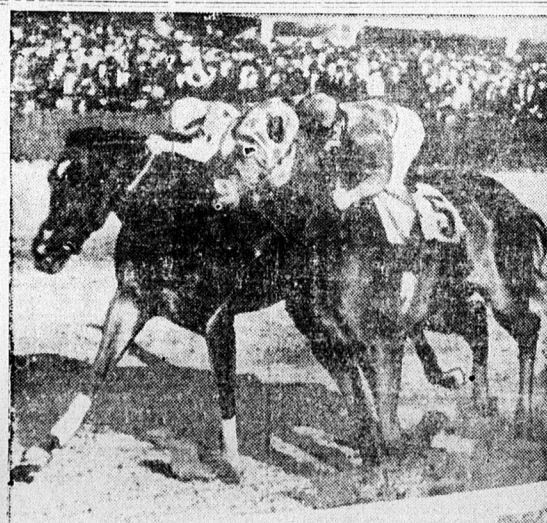

MR. KENNETH C. HOLM

At Victoria on March 23 last there passed away after a comparatively short period of failing health, Mr. Kenneth C. Holm, aged 87 years.

The late Mr. Holm was born at DeSable a son of the late Collin T. Holm and his wife Jane Stewart, and lived first at Hampton, then latterly at Victoria. He was twice married, his first wife being Annie MacCaldar, his second, Lydia Challett who survives him.
