RUSSIA MAKING ANOTHER MOVE

The Traditions of the Muscovite Diplomacy Again Finding Vent—A Scheme to Secure More Territory In China—Conducted After the Regular Russian Style of Conquest.

LONDON, April 29—(Special)—In spite of the defeat of her ambitions in Manchuria and of the obstacles met by the Russian Minister to China, Russia is steadily pushing forward with the purpose of occupying another big part of China—namely, the two eastern provinces of Mongolia, covering the route of the proposed railroad from Balkal to Pekin, which has been given over to the Russo-Chinese Bank.

MR. CARNEGIE AT CANADA'S CAPITAL

He Hands Out Boquets to Sir Wilfrid Laurier and The Governor General—Thinks Earl Grey Won Everybody on His Recent Visit to the United States.

OTTAWA, April 28—(Special)—At the Canadian Club banquet on Saturday Andrew Carnegie talked of the universal peace and better relations between Anglo-Saxons and the French. He referred to Laurier as one of the five greatest men of the world. The Canadian prime minister's greatest service had been performed in parliament, where he had declared Canada would never allow herself to be drawn into the vortex of militarism.

SAN FRANCISCO NEEDS MORE MONEY

SAN FRANCISCO, April 29—(Special)—Three hundred and thirty three bodies have already been found by Coronor Walsh and his assistants and the work of exhuming is still going on. Chairman Phelan announced today that more money than had been contributed was urgently needed. Of the two and a half millions voted by Congress only three hundred thousand had been received.

OFFICIAL REPORT JAPAN FAMINE

OTTAWA, April 27.—Hon. T. Nouse, Japanese consul-general, has received the following official report from his government in reference to the famine in Japan. It says that the number of destitute persons in the famine districts is over 300,000 at present. Of these about 130,000 must have food supplied to them free, and others are being supported by works specially provided for them by the local authorities. The measure taken by the government since the end of last year and liberal contributions given by both natives and foreigners have been very effective in the relief of the sufferers.

CANADIANS BUY PUEBLO RAILWAY

MEXICO CITY, April 27.—The Canadian syndicate which recently purchased the street railway lines of this city, it was said, has purchased all properties in Pueblo of the Pueblo Tramway Company, with some 27 kilometres of track. A change will be made to electric power and 34 kilometres will be added. It is probable that the electric undertaking in Pueblo will be organized under a separate company and that \$6,000,000 gold will be expended in improvements. Werner Beit and C. of London, owned the Pueblo street car lines.

HALIFAX, April 27.—An interesting and unique event took place at Government House when a number of members of the legislature representing counties with a Gaelic speaking population waited upon Lieut-governor Fraser and presented him with a handsomely engraved address in Gaelic. Lieut-governor Fraser replied in Gaelic in his happiest vein, assuring the deputation of the very great pleasure their address gave him. For the benefit of those whose early education had been neglected, he afterwards spoke briefly in English. All the Cape Breton members were present.
