## Banks

NEW YORK, Dec. 18—(AP)—Signs the stock market might be getting its back against the wall appeared today but they were not sufficient to prevent an assortment of leaders from dipping to new lows for more than three years.  
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 4 of a point at 36, another new bottom since April, 1923. Frequent bursts of tax selling put the day's turnover at 1,313,400 shares, largest in a week.  
Canadian stocks were easy. Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagram each lost 1-8 while Dome and Lake Shore Mines, Walkers, were off 1-8. International Nickel gained 5-8 and McIntyre Mines 1-2. Unchanged were Ford "A" and Imperial Oil.  
Heartening in the midst of the other cloudy happenings was the change of stock exchange seat at 40-year low.  
Among the day's principal share losers were American Telephone & Telegraph, J. I. Case & John-Manville 2, Sears Roebuck 1 3-4, and Allied Chemical 2.  
Conceding as much as 1 or so was General Motors Chrysler, S. Steel, Goodyear, Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, American Can, Western Union, Du Pont, Texas Co., Standard Oil (NJ) and Eastman Kodak.  
Small advances were retained by Santa Fe, N.Y. Central, Southern Pacific, Southern Railway, Bethlehem Steel, Youngstown Sheet & Tube, Anaconda, Kennecott, American Smelting, Phelps Dodge, Montgomery Ward, Goodrich, Goodyear and U.S. Rubber.

## By-Law Compelling The Removal Of Snow And Ice From Off The Side-Walks.

Attention of householders is called to the following extract from the City by-laws.  
"It shall be the duty of every tenant or occupier of any premises in the City, or in case there be no tenant, then of the owner of such premises to keep such portion of any public walk as shall be immediately in front of such premises free from snow at all times except that it shall be sufficient to have the same free from snow four hours after the ceasing of any snow storm, if such ceases in the daytime, or if in the night time then before ten o'clock in the day time following; and further to keep such portion of public walk free from ice at all reasonable times, otherwise to cover the same with sand, ashes or other materials sufficient to give safe footing."
