ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at an Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$2000. Deputy of the Minister of the Interior, B. and importance of newspaper advertising as against the benefits obtained by advertising campaigns in the magazines.
Mr. Rogers said in part: "Much of the lost motion and waste in modern business is represented by a misconception of the relations which should exist between the seller and the buyer of publicity. According to my conception of the proposition, the advertiser should absolutely demand that every medium in which he spends money delivers known and proved circulation as a prerequisite of the contract. Unless this is done you place a premium on the man of false statements."
Mr. Rogers showed how newspaper advertising was the most efficacious and satisfactory medium of reaching the consumer today, and advanced in proof of his contentions the following main arguments:
Newspaper space can be bought in exact accordance with the distribution of goods, and in co-operation with selling effort for 100 per cent. efficiency priced to the hour, and enabled to take advantage of changing conditions.
Magazines reach the people only once a month, as against the daily newspaper arrival.
Magazine campaigns lose heavily in efficiency through the necessity of preparing copy weeks in advance and long waits between blows.

SUFFRAGETTE OUTBREAK.
DUNDEE, Scotland, Feb. 3.—Well organized bands of suffragettes raised pandemonium during the ceremony of conferring the freedom of Dundee on Premier Asquith here. The Premier had hardly risen to acknowledge the honor when shrieks of "traitor," "traitor" resounded throughout the hall.
Stewards and policemen were soon busily occupied in throwing the women out of the building. Howls of "You Brutes; You Brutes" and sharp scurrimages marked the passage through the hall. One woman sprung over the front of the gallery and was only saved from falling among the crowded audience, twenty feet below, by the fact that several men seized her by the skirts and held her suspended.

EDITOR'S ANCESTOR IS NOT A DESERTER.

QUEBEC, Feb. 1.—As a reply to Sir Rodolphe Forget, who accused him in the House of Commons yesterday during the debate on the Lemieux charges against the Forget enterprise, that his ancestor had deserted the French army, Mr. D'Hellencourt, editor of Le Soleil, publishes a photographic reproduction of the letter of the President of the French Academy, that is evidence of his clean record.
Steps are being taken to invite a member of Parliament to ask for retraction of his allegation against Mr. D'Hellencourt from Sir Rodolphe.

EMPEROR RESTRAIN'S FORCES.

LONDON, Feb. 3.—Though the world expects guns to be booming at Adrianople again tonight the German emperor has interferred at the eleventh hour in a final effort for peace in the Balkans.
He has instructed the German minister at Sophia to make urgent representations to King Ferdinand and the advisability of accepting Turkey's latest proposal.
