Mayors Of Island Towns Invited To Conference July 29

Mr. J. F. Connolly, deputy-Minister of Reconstruction, has formally invited the mayors and town clerks of Alberton, Borden, Kensington, Montague, Georgetown, and Souris to meet at 2.30, July 29, in the Legislative Chambers at Charlottetown for the purpose of discussing the possibilities of co-ordinating the administrative functions of their various towns. Such co-ordination, Mr. Connolly informed the Guardian yesterday, would make it much easier for any particular town to obtain concessions or other assistance from the Provincial Government. Furthermore, Mr. Connolly said, if all six towns mentioned had uniform by-laws, they could implement their town planning program much more expeditiously.
