Part of the cargo of the Empress yesterday from Summerside, consisted of 1,000 busnel oats, 500 cases eggs, 200 bbls oysters, 20 bbls pork and one carload of live geese.

The following are the Alberton market prices, white and black oats, thirty six to thirty seven cents a bus; eggs, eighteen cents a doz; butter, eighteen cents a lb; hides, ten cents a lb; pork, nine to ten cents a lb; and hay eight to nine dollars a ton.

Summerside dealers, yesterday, were paying sixteen to eighteen cents a lb for butter, twenty cents a bus for potatoes, twenty to twenty-one cents a dozen for eggs, eight fifty a ton for loose hay and four fifty for straw, thirty-eight to thirty-nine cents a bus for oats and twenty cents a lb for wool.

Farmers and others interested in the produce markets should see the latest market reports, from the best authorities in Liverpool and London, and figure out the value of oats for themselves. It can easily be seen that at the present price of oats in England, the market price should not exceed 30 cents in Summerside or Charlottetown. The farmers and traders should pull together and strive to hold the local provincial trade from the northwestern grain, by keeping the prices just high enough to no higher. It would be a mistake to keep out the western grain and hold the oats back, looking for higher prices, and allow the western grain to fill the already weakening Provincial Market.

QUEBEC, Oct. 19.—The extent of the disaster of Saturday's fire is not measured by the money values of the conflagration losses. 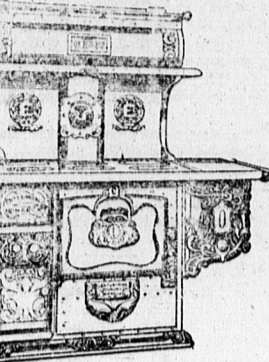

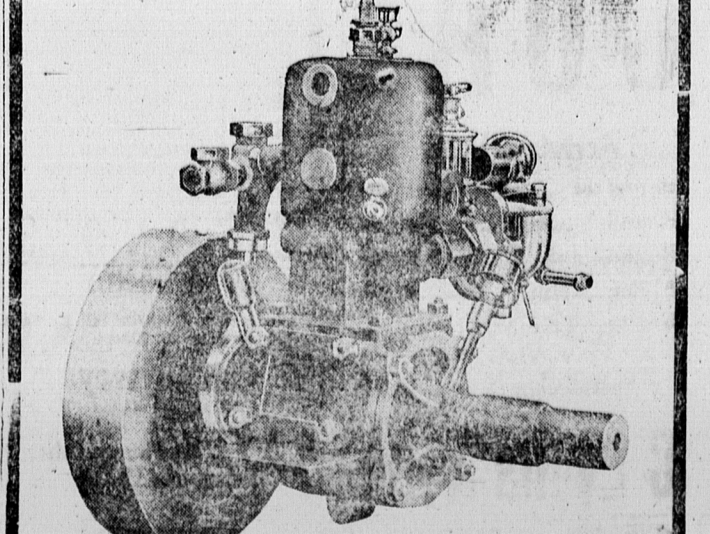

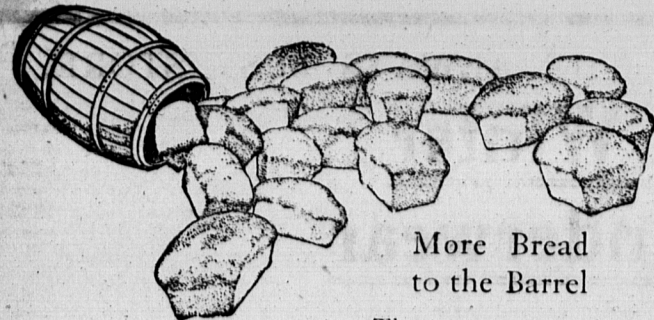
