**CANADIAN DAIRY PRODUCTS.**

In the report of the High Commissioner dated London, 9th April are mentioned some serious facts and statements to which our dairymen should give their prompt and earnest attention. In 1899 our export of butter to the British market was £1,113,956 and in 1900 it had fallen to £640,760, or little more than half. The complaint is that the quality has fallen off and that there is an increasing tendency to develop a "fishy flavor, the result mainly of unclean separators, which, in corrosion of metallic substances tends to produce the flavor in question."

The cheese trade, unlike the trade in butter, has expanded, but the High Commissioner records a number of complaints. It is said that Canadian cheeses lack good keeping qualities; that they are cured too hastily; that the boxes are not strong enough and do not fit properly; that there has been a distinct depreciation in flavor, with a tendency to rankness; that the weight is indistinctly scribbled on the boxes instead of being plainly marked; that cheese has been shipped in a raw or uncured state, from two to four days old; that the cheese have an acid texture and weedy flavor; that Ingersoll cheese have fallen much below their former standard; that both Canadian butter and cheese go "off flavor" quickly; that in some lots garlic flavor is noticed which is very disagreeable and reduces the value about fifty per cent.

Such is a brief summary of the complaints recorded. They are too serious to be lightly passed over. While it is gratifying to note that no unfavorable mention of Island butter or cheese is made in the report, while some other sections of Canada are singled out for unfavorable comment, yet we think there is a lesson in the above complaints for our own dairymen, cheese and butter makers as well as for others. Denmark is steadily increasing her exports of cheese and butter to the British markets by always maintaining a high standard of excellence. The competition from many quarters is very great and is yearly increasing so that we can only hope to increase our sales, or even to hold our present ground by using the utmost skill and care, and by adopting every possible improvement. We commend a careful consideration of the facts to our factory men throughout the Island.

An interesting series of successful experiments have been carried out in the way of fighting farm and orchard pests with parasites. For years the very existence of the orange groves in California was threatened by the "fluted scale." Then a bug, the Australian "ladybird" was imported and it multiplied in such numbers that in a year it practically destroyed the scale. In like manner when the black scale threatened to destroy the olive orchards of California another ladybird was found in Australia that proved an effective remedy. And now a fungus is being brought from Australia to destroy the grasshoppers, having proved successful at the antipodes. An entomologist is now on the way to Japan, China and Java hoping to find some parasite which will destroy the San Jose scale, which is so harmful to all kinds of fruit trees in the United States and Canada.

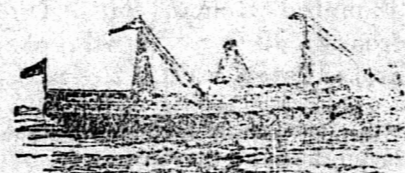
