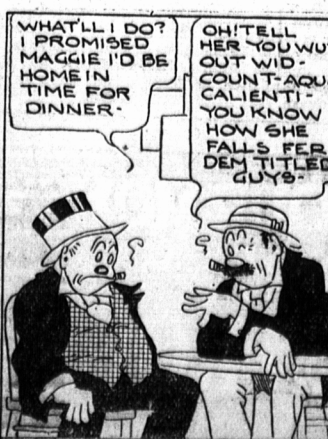
The Markets

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., Oct. 8.—Cattle receipts 2,269. Cattle sales were slow and although at time of writing only canners and bulls had been weighed prices on all grades looked lower and there was a possibility of some butcher cattle remaining unsold. The bulk of the canners and cutters were weighed to a Toronto buyer for from \$3.75 to \$4.50. Bulls were 25 to 50 cents lower, selling mostly \$5.50 to \$5.75. Calf receipts 2,764. Veal calves were in good demand at prices ranging from \$12.50 to \$14.50 for the best lots. Grass calves were estimated to be from 50 cents to \$1.00 lower. The bulk of sales here ranged around \$6.00 with a range of from \$5.50 to \$7.00. Quotations: Gool veal, \$13.00 to \$14.50; medium, \$11.00 to \$12.50; top, \$8.00 to \$10.50; grass \$5.50 to \$7.00. Sheep receipts, 5,677. Lambs were offered \$11.00 for good lambs and sellers holding for more money. Common to medium lambs were being sold from \$9.50 to \$10.50. Sheep were from \$3.00 to \$6.00; ewes, \$3.00 to \$6.00; lambs common, \$9.00 to \$10.50. Hog receipts, 3,486. On one market where only 400 hogs were offered sales were made to butchers of coal for W. D. Gillis & Co. at \$11.50 with a top of \$12.00 and \$11.00 on the other market. where 3,000 hogs were offered packers bid \$11.00 and odd sales to butchers were made up to \$11.25, sows were from \$10.50 to \$11.00.
