### U. S. General Is Convicted

WASHINGTON, March 12 — (AP) — A jury today convicted Maj.-Gen. Bennett E. Meyers on charges of inducing a witness to lie to a senate committee.  
The wartime deputy United States army air forces purchasing chief was found guilty on all three counts of an indictment.  
Judge Alexander Holtzoff said he will sentence Meyers Monday. The retired general could get a maximum of 30 years in prison.  
The jury required two hours and 50 minutes to reach the verdict.  
The dapper 52-year-old officer took the decision with apparent calm. His wife, the former Hollywood actress, Ila Rae, appeared in the court room, also showed no emotion.  
Meyers was released on bond pending his sentencing.  
His lawyers indicated they will appeal the verdict but Judge Holtzoff said he would not permit Meyers to remain free after he is sentenced and while his appeal is pending.  
The jury was made up of 10 men and two women.

### Legislatures Across Canada

Provincial legislation to roll back prices was proposed in the Alberta Legislature on Thursday, as Premier E. C. Manning said his government planned to enforce market-up controls on the basis of prices prevailing when the Federal Government's decontrol orders were issued.

The new session started in the Nova Scotia Legislature, last Provincial House to open this year, and Throne Speech debate continued in most other Provincial Parliaments.

After the Nova Scotia Throne Speech, which forecast legislation for a redistribution of seats and amendments to eight acts, including the year-old Labor Act, the House adjourned for ceremonies and speeches recalling that Nova Scotia on Feb. 2, 1848, became the first colony overseas to obtain responsible government from Britain.

Concluding the New Brunswick Throne Speech from the Opposition side of the House, F. G. Squires (PC-Carleton) declared his Province's Government "snoozed in her rocking chair" and allowed wartime industries and an opportunity for revival of industry to slip into the hands of the Central Provinces. The debate was scheduled to be concluded today by Health Minister F. A. McGrand.

A Prince Edward Island Federation of Agriculture brief, read to the Legislature at Charlottetown, urged the Provincial Government to declare meat packing plants public works, to compel arbitration of wage disputes and to prohibit strikes during arbitration proceedings. The House gave second reading to several bills including remaining portions of a Charlottetown Incorporation Act.  
Quebec's Legislative Assembly, sitting afternoon and evening, took up a government bill to extend for a year existing legislation authorizing the Government to come to an agreement with the Federal Government on taxation. The Legislative Council, provincial Upper House, approved a number of bills including one authorizing companies to set up pension schemes for their employees.

Throne Speech debate continued in the Ontario Legislature, with a C. C. F. and a Progressive Conservative speaker joining in denouncing Communism. Government bills dealing with education, change of name act, public vehicles act and surveys act were given first reading along with an opposition bill proposing an increase in workmen's compensation payments.

Premier Stuart Garson of Manitoba told the Legislature at Winnipeg that events had established that his Province was correct in opposing the application of Canada's two major railways for an increase in freight rates.  
He said that at hearings into the rates application, both railways took the position that freight tonnage for 1947 would be less than in 1946 but Manitoba submitted that total tonnage would be 10.3 per cent greater than in 1943. Figures now available covering 1947 up to Nov. 1 showed a rise of 10.8 per cent, he said.

In Saskatchewan budget debate, A. W. Embury (armed services) charged that a Regina butcher, a Mr. Schan, was given contracts for gravelling roads although "he is not a contractor, doesn't know the first thing about the business and owns no gravelling equipment." He said Mr. Schan is president of the East Regina C. C. F. Association.

Speaking on the prices question, Alberta's Premier Manning said present regulations calling for a minimum five-per-cent markup on the established wholesale price of consumer goods are intended to prevent agricultural products from being sold by large stores as "loss leaders." But the Alberta Government, noting "excessive prices of consumer goods," felt there should be no laws preventing merchants from reducing such prices, he added.

At Victoria, Premier Byron Johnson announced a two-cent-a-gallon boost in the retail price of gasoline. Opposition leader Harold Winch sought unsuccessfully to have the Legislature adjourn "on a matter of public importance" to open the way for discussion of the price boost.

**Ghost-Writing Of Speeches Denounced**

BOSTON, March 12 — (AP) — Daniel I. Marsh, Boston University president, today denounced ghost-writing of speeches of new in public life as "dishonest." He said the speakers should be compelled by law to tell who wrote their addresses.  
Dr. Marsh assailed the man in public life who because he "is too

lazy or dumb to write his own speeches and messages, is likely to plagiarize or to hire some ghost writer to write them for him."  
Speaking at the University's fifth annual Founder's Day Institute, Dr. Marsh said public relations should be regarded as a profession comparable with the

ministry, law, medicine and teaching, entered only by persons who have pursued a course of study leading to a professional degree.
