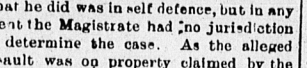

Stipendiary Magistrate Inman, last evening at Montague delivered judgment in the case brought by John Aben McDonald against Murdoch McDonald, an action for assault and battery. The suit was tried at Montague on the 30th October, and considerable interest was taken in the proceedings, enhanced as they were by the presence of two lawyers from Charlottetown. The complainant charged that he had been badly beaten by the defendant, who, on his part, claimed that what he did was in self defence, but in any event the Magistrate had no jurisdiction to determine the case. As the alleged assault was on property claimed by the defendant, and the question of title coming up for consideration the magistrate's right to try the case was ousted. Stipendiary Inman took this view, and dismissed the information. Norman A. Campbell, of W. S. Stewart's office, presented the case for the complainant; and J. J. Johnston acted for the defendant.
