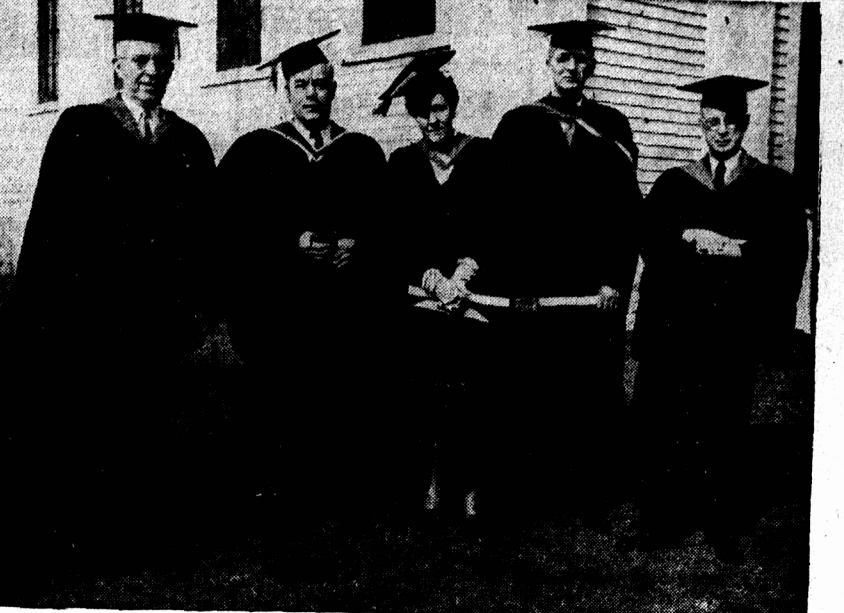

 A feeling of sadness pervaded Cape Traverse and vicinity on Wednesday, May 12, when it became known that Mrs. Willard Crooks had suddenly passed away at the age of fifty-five years. While driving home in the car of a kind neighbour she suffered a stroke.
