COPYRIGHT ACT. OTTAWA, Jan. 23—Copies of the new copyright act have been received by the government from England. The act is made to be effective in all parts of the Empire with the consent of each Dominion, given through enactment, and subject to such modification as the Dominions may enact. All or any copyright acts passed by the British Parliament may be repealed by a Dominion so far as they operate in the Dominion without prejudice to existing legal rights. Such rights as may be granted by order in council under the act in Great Britain are not conferred in the several Dominions except by orders in council of the Dominions. Whether or not there will be any copyright legislation before the Canadian parliament this session has not been decided. SERBIAN CONSPIRACY. BELGRADE, Serbia, Jan. 23—The existence of a secret society, known as Black Hand, has been discovered among the younger officers of the Salvation Army. The subject is supposed to be anti-dynastic, and as a consequence of its discovery the Crown Prince has resigned his post as inspector general of the army, which carries with it the duties of commander-in-chief.
