GREAT STRIKE IN AUSTRALIA SETTLED.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., March 13—The strike of the Northern coal miners which has been in progress since early in November was declared off today, thus ending the difficulties in the New South Wales coal fields. The Southern miners resumed work last night.

During the strike, which affected 12,000 miners, the price of coal jumped from \$7 to \$16 a ton. The question of higher wages and better working conditions precipitated the conflict.

Four of the strike leaders were sentenced to terms of imprisonment during the trouble, having been convicted of obstructing work at the mines.

THE RESULT OF CORONER'S INQUEST.

FORT WILLIAM, March 13—The inquest held last night into the death of J. Verniah, whose body was found a few days ago near the trail leading from Beck's siding on the C. P. R. to Camp Buelah, operated by the Dominion Bessemer Iron Company, the jury found that the man had been murdered at the hands of a fellow countryman named Frank Matt, and the body hidden under a pile of brush and stones in the early part of November, 1909. The police are searching for Matt.

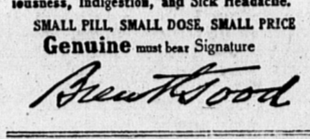

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole holder of a family or any male over 18 years of age may, home stead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Three—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$8.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.

Wise have I seen the uses of life's labor; To all its puzzles found some answering clue. But now my life has learned a nobler meaning, Because of you.

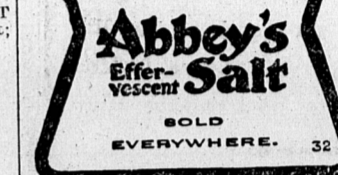
In the past days I chafed at pain and waiting— Grasping at gladness as the children do; Now is it sweet to wait and joy to suffer, Because of you.
