Centennial At East Point

The morning devotional service of the second day of the Centennial Anniversary was conducted by Dr. H. D. Raymond, who chose for his subject, "Paul's Helpers," namely Demas who forsook him. Mark who turned back, and Luke, who remained true to the end. He applied it as a comparison to our Church today where we still find the same characters. Dr. Meltek gave an address on the organization of the first church at East Point, which took place on July 12, 1833, with a membership of eighteen. The benediction was pronounced by Rev. W. R. MacWalker. The evening service was opened with a devotional service, led by Rev. H. R. Bell, and prayer by Dr. Mason. An inspiring address was then given by Rev. W. R. MacWalker, a former pastor of this church. His message was chosen from Matthew 5-14, "Ye are the light of the world." The second speaker was Dr. S. S. Poole, of St. John, N. B., who gave a stirring message of the challenge of the Baptist Church. He emphasized the urgent need for worship, witness and work. The church also challenges us to prayer and giving, and that as a church we must be the lights in the world to those outside and bring them in. His message was inspirational and soul-stirring.
