WASHING HOOKED RUGS AT HOME
Handmade rugs of cut rugs hooked through a base of coarse burlap may usually be cleaned quite safely at home by scrubbing with a brush dipped in a thick, mild suds. Dip the brush into the suds, not the water, so that the surface, not the backing is dampened, and scrub only a small area at a time, taking care to overlap the strokes. Wipe off the suds with a clean wet cloth and spread in a shady, airy place to dry. A little ammonia added to the suds tends to brighten the colors.

BRISTLE BRUSHES HAVE MANY USES
A soft floor brush is a convenient tool for dusting room walls as well as brushing smooth floors and linoleums. The brush, of course, must be absolutely clean, and it may be safely washed when necessary in a mild solution of borax and warm water or ammonia and warm water. Douze only the bristles in the bath, taking care not to wet the back of the brush, lest the bristles loosen and shed. Rinse in clear water and hang bristles pointing down in an airy place to dry.

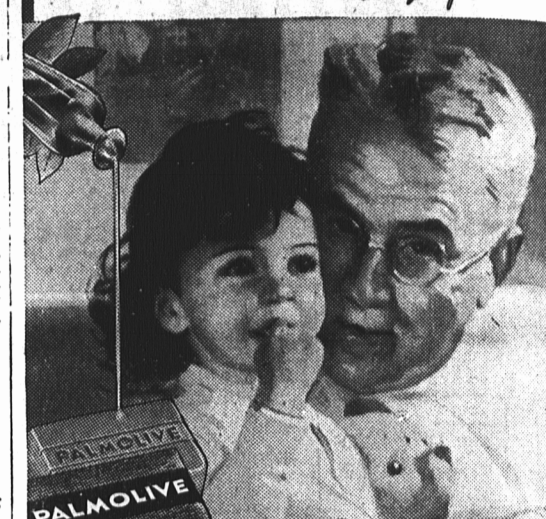
ORANGE CAKE

One cup sugar, 1-2 cup butter, 2 eggs (beaten separately), 1-2 cup milk, 2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1-2 cup orange juice. Method: Cream butter and sugar, add beaten yolks of eggs, beat well; add milk, flour and baking powder, alternately. Beat well and add orange juice; fold in stiffly beaten whites of eggs. Cook in layer-cake tins. This makes a large cake. Filling: Six and one-half tablespoons sugar, 2-3 tablespoons flour, a little salt, 1 egg-yolk, 1-1-3 tablespoons butter, 9 tablespoons boiling water, juice of 1-3 oranges, juice of 1-2 lemons. Cook all except the spices until thick, remove from fire, add juice and spread on cake. Filling: One cup white sugar, 1-2 cup water. Boil until it forms a soft ball when dropped into water. Having egg-white beaten stiff, and pour the mixture over sugar, beating all the while; just before spreading add the grated rind of orange.

PRUNE COOKIES

1-2 cup butter 1 cup sugar 2 egg yolks 1 cup prune pulp 1-2 teaspoon salt 2 cups flour (about) 1 teaspoon cinnamon 1 teaspoon soda 1-4 teaspoon cloves and nutmeg 1-4 cup chopped nuts Method: Cream the sugar and butter (or shortening, for you can substitute shortening in a recipe that has as much spice as this one has). Add the well beaten egg yolks and beat hard. Stir in the prune pulp to which the salt has been added. Sift the flour with the soda and spices and add, then add the chopped nuts. Mix lightly and add a very little more flour if necessary. The dough should be just stiff enough to drop from the tip of a spoon. Drop onto a greased cookie sheet, about 2 inches apart, and bake in a moderate, 350 deg. F. oven, until a delicate brown—about 15 minutes.
