## MONTREAL, June 4 (CP)—

Butter, cheese and egg prices were steady to a shade firmer on open produce markets here last week but potatoes weakened, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.

Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 22-22 1-2 cents a pound and solids for 21 3-4-22 cents a pound delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 21 7-8. Receipts: 21,077 boxes, compared with 23,176 a year ago. Cheese was offered at 11 cents a pound. Receipts: 13,979 boxes, compared with 19,597 a year ago.

Graded egg shipments in used free cases offered at 21-21 1-2 cents a dozen for A-large, 18 1-2-19 for A-medium; 18 for B-large and 16 for C. Receipts: 9,382 cases compared with 8,897 a year ago.

TORONTO, June 4 (CP)—Offerings proved to be light on the Toronto stock market in the first session of the week and buyers were obliged to advance bids moderately. All indices closed narrowly higher with the gold group registering the best advance. The gold share index, up 42 for the day was within a half-point of the top of last week's rally and the base metal shares finished the session at 88 1/2, their best index level in two months. Volume was small at 160,000 shares.

Sigma advanced 30 cents to 7.20. Its top price for the year and net gains of 5 to 10 cents were headed by Aurifer, Uchi and Perron and smaller gains were netted by Monteta, Hard-Rock, MacLeod-Cock-shutt, McIntyre, Preston, Paymaster and San Antonio. Of the senior group, Hollinger and McIntyre gained slightly and other issues were firm.

Smelters, Nickel and Hudson Bay were stronger and Noranda was unchanged. Cheaper base metal shares held steady and in the silvers Eldorado posted a 2-cent gain. Interlisted leaders were inclined to firmness.

Home Oil, Uchi again the big trader of the western oil group and it closed slightly higher at 2-50. Minor gains were netted by Okalta and Firestone. Anglo-Canadian closed at 1.08, off a cent.

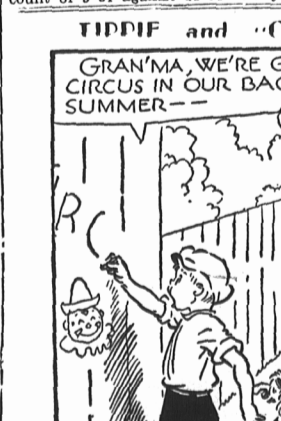

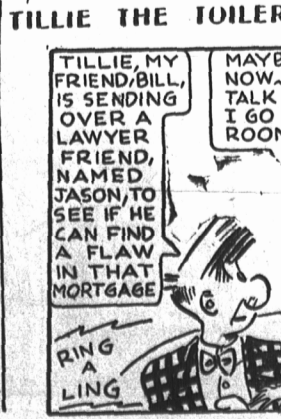

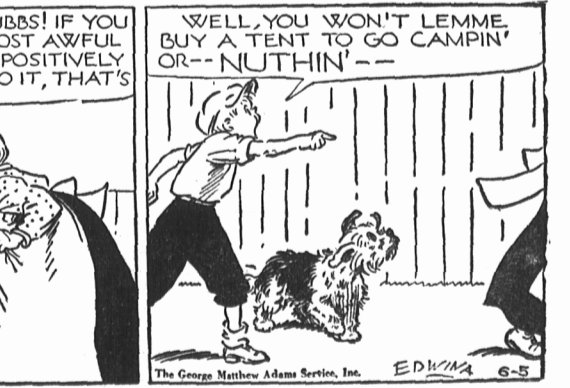
