(Temperance Lesson.)

Exodus 32: 15-20, 30-35.

GOLDEN TEXT

"My little children, guard yourselves from idols."—1 John 5: 21.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS

Between the pure, unadorned heights of God and the depths of the abysmal degradation of a heathen orgy there is room for vivid contrasts and the play of forces which are forever antagonistic and irreconcilable. The lesson pictures to us with full dramatic power the intense situation when such antagonisms meet.

An interesting and instructive study of character is afforded in the conduct of Moses and Aaron—Moses, when coming from the heights of supreme privilege and leadership, and Aaron, when troubled and provokingly pressed by the wishes and whims of a multitude who are childish in their fickleness, stubborn in their complaints and without faith or gratitude or vision.

It is not wise to credit Moses with every virtue of ability or religion nor to charge Aaron with an utter lack of any of them. So-called righteous anger may exceed, as with Moses, and religious leadership may grievously fail, as with Aaron. Let it be understood that neither of them measured to the Christ-like.

Opinion may differ as to the grandeur of the wrath of Moses when he became aware of the idolatrous feasting of the people, but this one thing is certain, that if the same spirit took possession of righteous men today against iniquitous practices, such as drunkenness, licentiousness, industrial slavery, etc., the original "gold cure" of Moses would find speedy and effective counterpart in wiping out the scenes, and traffics and opportunities of such vicious deeds and doings from the face of the earth.

Let not this more worthy lesson, however, be forgotten—the second thoughts of Moses were better than his first, while the deeds of his first impulses left his hands empty of the sacred things committed to them. His second thought—his overnight reflections—took him back to God and to the spirit of mighty intercession. "There is where Moses is seen at his best."

The pitiful exhibit which Aaron while yielding to the irritating weakness of the people and their clamor for somewhat to take the place of their absentee leader is repeated by the church when it stoops to cater to the so-called needs and cries of the times. Carnal methods can never build a spiritual church. But for the suggestion of any worldling as to how to run a church there is found some preacher as its advocate.

And sinners are always great scientists in the handling of old junk. Wonderful designs come from its recasting like the calf from the gold of the Israelites. But as the Israelites sinned in laying down their gold to worship what came out of it, so sinners today cannot fashion their gods by any transformation of their wealth without sin. Jehovah is unmakeable and unpurchasable.

Moreover, He judges righteously, and the interceding Moses cannot die for another's sin. He is better fitted for leadership by the spirit of self-surrendering love which has entered his soul, and to that duty God sent

him. Likewise, the track of one's business is better discerned from the place of prayer than from the place of its stifling activities.

"Thy book"—"My book," meaning God's Book. These are solemn assertions of record which the lesson makes. No one can give himself to more careful or prayerful thinking than to the most earnest inquiry as to his relation to the record.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

Life is the priceless gift of God. What shall a man give in exchange for his life?

Earnestness is a mark of the reformer. It is often mistaken for presumption, and those who should glory in it sometimes resist it. But, as with Moses, so with other leaders—earnestness is best when disciplined into wisdom.

The supremest moment in the history of a soul is when the presence of God is consciously realized. And that relation comes to everyone in one form or another. Learn the significance of Exod. 3: 4 in that regard.

Moses had to suffer the pain of those who would see the burdens of men lifted from them at a word. He had rather to witness the increase of them as though his leadership was impotent. But the victories of social and moral struggles do not rest with man, but with God.

Yet Pharaoh was in the grip of Jehovah. So is the judgment and destiny of every oppressor.

Pharaoh yielded ungraciously and only after every resource of his temporal power failed him against the demands of righteousness. Nevertheless he has had many successors in his hardening procrastination. What are you now holding which God would have you let go?

"Enter ye in at the straight gate." Those who are led of God and delivered are not those who disobey Him. The strictness with which the Passover preparation were to be observed is significant of much. "If we regard iniquity in our hearts the Lord will not hear us."

Ought not common gratitude to have saved the Children of Israel from their complaining in the wilderness? Alas, that the memory of a good received is so short in the presence of a want which is at hand. But God appeals to past experiences of His goodness as the proof of His present and future purposes.

Political policy, and religious as well, demands that a people should

have the guidance and protection of law. Commandments are necessary. Liberty comes by law and can only be maintained by it.

"Let all the people praise Thee, O God." Such is the song of praise to the worshiper. An interesting study is the relation of song to worship to the teaching and belief of one true God.

Every one of the Ten Commandments is basal to many principles of right living. The interpretation which Jesus gives to them in the Sermon on the Mount is suggestive of that fact.

"Guard yourself from idols." Is it not strange that it needs to be spoken yet? Idols! There are nothing in the world. But people have them, and in having them they have the world.

Only God can save. Only God can keep. Only God has the right of possession, for His is the right of ownership. Did He not speak truly, saying, "Let my people go"? And that is the clamant call of righteousness today concerning all who are in any sort oppressed: Let my people go.
