IN MEMORIAM

MRS. MICHAEL QUIGLEY

The death of Martha Ann, wife of Mr. Michael Quigley took place at her home in Montrose on April 15th, 1921. She was a daughter of the late Richard Dawson, of Tignish, P. E. I., and was born in North Tryon, P. E. I., February 8th, 1853. She leaves to mourn her death, Edith, Ethel and Ida at home, one son Dawson of Springfield, Mass., four brothers, Johnston of Tignish, P. E. I., Warren of East Claire, Wis., Hamilton of Bethel, Wash., Benjamin of Maine.

The deceased had been in failing health for several years. But about two weeks ago took a sudden turn for the worse and despite the very best medical and nursing attendance she succumbed.

The late Mrs. Quigley belonged to one of the most respected families in the community. The esteem in which she was held was clearly shown by the largely attended funeral.

The service was held in the house on Monday morning, April 18th, and was conducted by Rev. W. S. Godfrey. Interment was made in the Alberton Methodist Cemetery.

MRS. BRIDGET DOYLE

At St. Mark's, Lot 7, on Friday, April 8th, fortified with the last rites of Holy Mother, the church there passed peacefully to her eternal reward Mrs. Bridget Doyle, relict of the late Peter Doyle, who predeceased her four years ago. Mrs. Doyle was born at Kildare, P. E. I., and had attained to the advanced age of eighty-nine years. She had been a resident of St. Mark's since her marriage sixty-five years ago. In her passing this community loses one of its oldest and most respected pioneers. She was of a kindhearted, hospitable disposition and was revered and loved by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance.

Until the past year she had always been robust and strong, and when the final illness came she bore it, to the edification of all, with that true christian fortitude for which she had been always known.

She kept her mental faculties in a most remarkable degree to the last and was a favorite with both old and young.

Her funeral took place to St. Mark's cemetery on Sunday afternoon the 10th inst., and notwithstanding the almost impassable state of the roads, was largely attended by mourners and sympathetic friends from far and near who came to pay a last tribute of respect to one they had always admired and esteemed. The pallbearers were: Charles Gorman, Fred O'Holloran, John O'Holloran, George Dalton, Daniel Doyle and Eugene McCarthy. The service in the church was conducted by Rev. Dr. Gauthier, P. P., Palmer Road, assisted by the pastor, Rev. J. A. MacDonald, who performed the last sad rites at the grave.

The deceased is survived to mourn their loss by one son, Thomas with whom she lived on the old Doyle homestead at St. Mark's, also by two daughters: Mrs. William Callaghan, St. Louis, P. E. I., and Mrs. Patrick Hammill, Free-town. She also leaves to mourn two brothers, John and Michael Foley of Kildare, besides a large number of grand and great-grand children.

On the following Monday morning the funeral Mass of requiem was celebrated in St. Mark's Church by Rev. J. A. MacDonald, P. P. with Rev. Dr. Gauthier assisting in the choir.

EDWARD C. BROOKS
 1854-1921

Edward Corless Brooks died, at his residence "The Lilacs" 309 High Street, West Medford, Mass., on Tuesday, April 5th.

Though never robust, Mr. Brooks had enjoyed good health till in the

spring of 1920, he was stricken with pneumonia. He recovered from this attack but when on April 2nd, 1921 he was again laid low with the same disease it was realized that hope of recovery was small. His death though not unexpected was a severe shock to his wife and family.

Edward C. Brooks was the scion of one of the oldest and most respected New England families, members of which have held high positions of trust in city and state. "The Lilacs" was one of the centres of Boston's social life and today contains many interesting historical souvenirs among which might be mentioned the Chickering piano on which Jenny Lind played on her first trip to America.

During the summer of 1910, Mr. Brooks spent a month on P. E. I. visiting Charlottetown and western points. He ever after spoke in glowing terms of its pastoral beauty and the hospitality of its people.

He married Sarah McDonald, daughter of the late Captain Hughie McDonald. She with their two sons, Herbert employed with the firm of James McDuffee and Stratton, and Edward of the Senior Medford High School, survive him. The latter who is a nephew of our distinguished athlete Mr. D. J. McDonald, is proving himself a worthy successor in the athletic field to his uncle having broken the record for the 4000 yd. dash in the Mass. State High School Meet.

The body of Ed. C. Brooks was laid to rest in the family plot at Mt. Auburn cemetery. Among the bearers were Mr. John Gillis, president of the Board of Aldermen formerly of Arlington, P. E. I., and Dr. Philip Farrell formerly of Tignish, P. E. I.

The floral offerings were numerous and beautiful.—N.

MRS. JOSHUA MACDONALD

Lauretta Stewart, wife of Joshua MacDonald, died at her home, Kingsboro, P. E. I., March 1st, 1921, aged 45 years. Early in the winter season, friends learned with deep regret that Mrs. MacDonald was ill. Soon the regret became fear, lest the illness should be more serious than at first supposed. Several doctors ministered to her, striving to stay the progress of her disease.

Practically, and an operation in the Prince Edward Island gave her temporary relief, and until within two days of her death, loved ones and friends entertained bright hopes of at least a prolonging of some months, of the earthly life.

Then a sudden relapse into physical weakness shattered the hopes of those who so anxiously watched for every sign of progress.

Mrs. MacDonald was, by the common consent of the community, "a good woman". Like the ideal woman mentioned in the Book of Proverbs, she "looked well to the ways of her household", so that "her children arise up and call her blessed, her husband also and he praiseth her."

Hospitally was to her, a delight and even until the last days of her earthly life her thoughts were for the comfort of the friends who visited her to say farewell.

In her religious life she was practical. A member of the Baptist Church she was a regular and devout worshipper, and her profession found expression in deeds and many are left to testify to the kindness of her heart and to the readiness of her hand to assist others in time of need.

Narrowness had no place in her creed; but goodness was frankly appreciated and sympathetically encouraged wherever found.

Her leave taking of this world was most beautiful. There was the desire to remain with the loved ones; but this desire was yielded to the second place by devotion to the will of God. Calling the loved ones to her bedside she offered them words of comfort assuring that with God, and that soon she would be "forever with Him."

To the pastor of the Church she gave a beautiful testimony fearing not that her sins would meet her as her Saviour had cancelled them, claiming no personal righteousness, but resting on the love of God.

The funeral services were conducted at her home and at the graveside by Rev. W. R. MacWalk of the Baptist and Christian Churches. The hymns, "O Think Day the Silver Chord Will Break" and "Sweet Bye and Bye", were sung by the united choirs.

A sister, Mrs. Baker of Boston, Mass., and a brother, Edison Stewart of Souris, her husband and three small children, are left to mourn. To them a sorrowing community extends heartfelt sympathy.

AMBROSE SULLIVAN

On Saturday morning April 23, Ambrose Sullivan passed peacefully away at his home in Vernon, fortified by the last rites of the Catholic Church. He was sick only five weeks but in that brief space of time he prepared himself, for his Eternal Home by prayer and frequent repentance in the Blessed Sacrament. He bore his suffering with Christian fortitude and was conscious to the last. During his illness he frequently told those about him that he was going to a better place. The late Mr. Sullivan was born at Vernon, January 4, 1886, and spent the greater part of his short life at his home. He was one of the most prosperous farmers in that vicinity.
