Protect Child Slayer From Mob Violence

ST. CATHARINES, Ont., Jan. 5 (CP)—Fearful of mob violence, a special guard was mustered today at city police station which held jittery Sidney George Chambers, confessed slayer of nine-year-old Marion Busnak.

Police announced Saturday that the 34-year-old stationary engineer admitted abducting the little girl two days before he was arrested. He was held in a room with a toy drum for her brother, then strangling her and throwing her body into a furnace.

Most extensive search and manhunt in the history of this Niagara Peninsula city which was scheduled to include the draining of the old Welland Canal today, ended when police announced Saturday that Chambers had been remanded to Jan. 10 in connection with the case.

Arrest of the slender, nervous conning plant boiler hater came five days ago when he attempted to commit suicide by slashing his wrists and was found unconscious in his gas-filled plant dormitory. He made a second attempt on his own life Friday night when he tried to hang himself from a bar in his cell.

Married and father of an eight-year-old girl living in Toronto, Chambers came to St. Catharines seven months ago.

Provincial Police entered the search and ashes from two boiler fires at the cannery company plant where he worked and washed piece-by-piece. Charred pieces of material "not believed to be ashes" were found and will be analyzed by provincial pathologists.

Drugs were injected when investigations were placed under Provincial Police Inspector Charles Wood, who broke the Dick murder case in Hamilton, where burned bodies of her husband played an important part in the conviction of Mrs. Evelyn Dick.

Joined the C.P.R. in declaring that the present was not the time for a general inquiry, though the railway would not object to regional claims being put forward after disposition of this case.

Ralston's Stand

Col. Ralston took the stand that the railways had advanced "quite insufficient grounds" for not providing advance particulars.

Col. Ralston struck out at the railways' claims of financial extremity as a ground for hastening the inquiry.

Most of the C.P.R.'s additional revenue calculated under 30 per cent rate increases in 1947 - \$37,000 in all - was to go for dividends and income tax, he said.

"That's the financial extremity of the C.P.R.," he observed.

"For the C.N.R.," he continued, "the one can talk of financial extremity now, having regard to the condition it was in for years and years."

What the provinces wanted to know particularly, he said, was whether freight was to be the "load horse" carrying the bulk of the railways' burden, whether there should be increases in rates, or whether additional revenue should be a public charge.

Baruch Resigns Atomic Commission

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 (AP)—Bernard M. Baruch, completing the job that he once said might close his public career, resigned Saturday night as United States member of the United Nations Atomic Commission. In a letter to President Truman he said there is no reason why the United States should not continue to make atomic bombs.

Baruch expressed his view on continued manufacture of the bomb which is contrary to Russia's urging to outlaw the weapon promptly, in his letter of resignation.

Truman, accepting the resignation, agreed that from now on, American atomic representation at the United Nations should be centered in Warren R. Austin, member of the Security Council. That was what Baruch proposed.

Reaction In U.N. Circles

NEW YORK Jan. 5 (AP)—Reaction in United Nations circles to Bernard M. Baruch's resignation as American representative to the U. N. Atomic Energy Commission today centered around any effect on the differences still splitting Russia and the United States.

Delegates, expressing regret at Baruch's leaving, were slow to comment on the possible political implications but one factor was noted: that the first Baruch has stood firm on the major points of his (the Baruch) plan for control of atomic energy and has stated repeatedly that he would not give way.

In some quarters passing of the United States representation from Baruch to Warren R. Austin, who will take over the permanent Security Council seat, was viewed as opening the way for more leeway in the American stand.

Will Operate Under Old Business Name?

Although it could not be confirmed here, a
