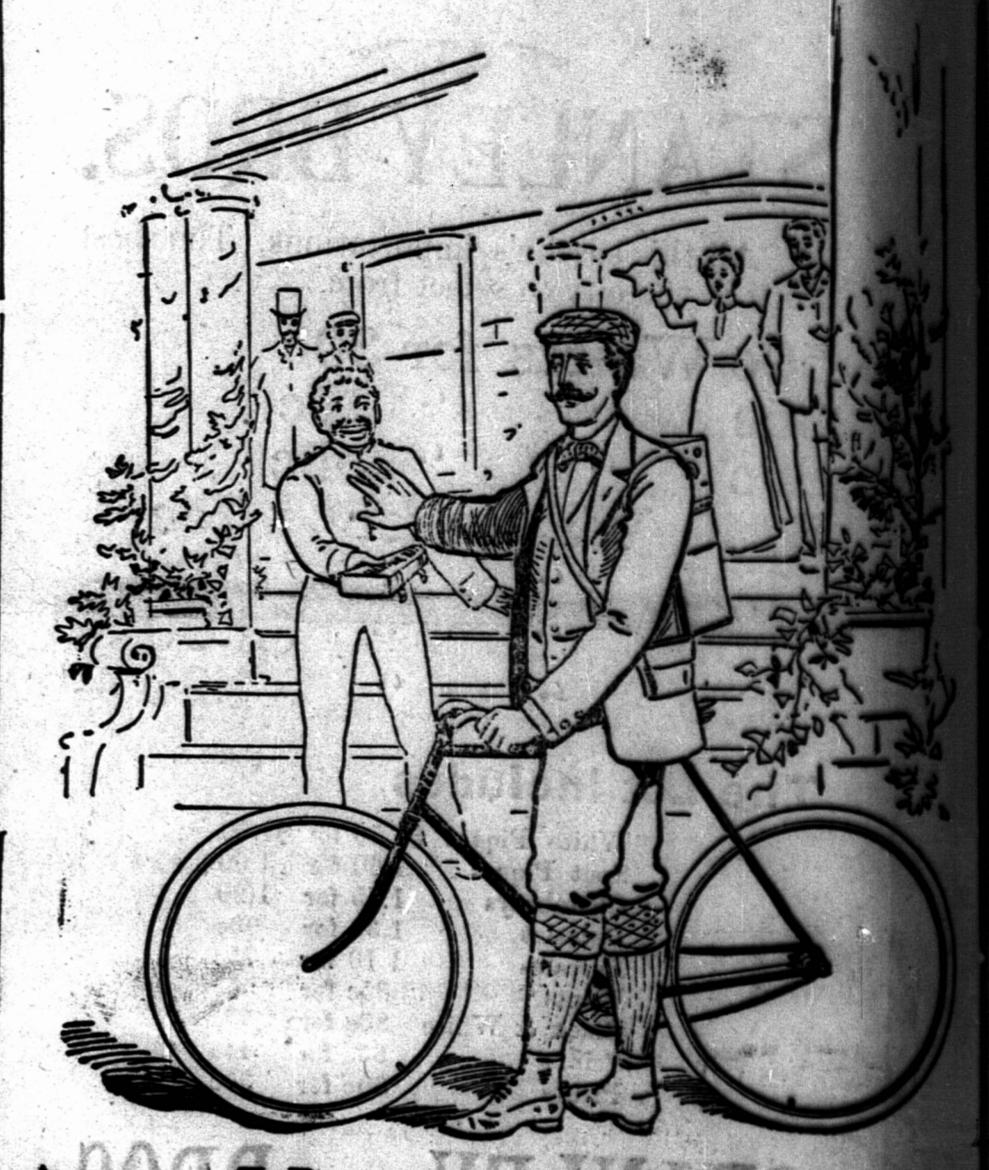
Misjudged.
