USE OF MORE HARD COAL.

Reference was made in a previous issue of The Guardian to the fact that there has been recently a marked increase in the importation of hard or Anthracite coal from the United States into this province. At Messrs. C. Lyons & Co. the American three-masted schooner Sedgewick has just finished discharging eight hundred tons of hard coal, and her place has now been taken by the three-master Laura M. Hunt from New York which has also brought 800 tons of hard coal from the States. Besides these two vessels there are others in from New York with cargoes of hard coal. In conversation with a Guardian man yesterday Mr. Lyons said that the consumption of hard coal had largely increased recently and he attributed the growing consumption to this fact: The farmers are using more hard coal now than ever before, they are employing the coal for their hall heating stoves and making more general use of it than previously.

CHEMICAL FIRE ENGINE.—The Charlottetown Fire Brigade is shortly to be equipped with a small chemical fire engine which it is felt will go some way towards rendering the Brigade better fitted for effective fire-fighting. At present the City Fire is in correspondence with various fire appliance manufacturing firms with view to the selection of the most suitable of these chemical fire engines, of which there are more than one manufacture on the market. The engine that is to be purchased for this city will be of a size small enough to be drawn by hand, and is not expected to cost more than \$150 to \$200. After all the chief purpose of this kind of appliance is to be early at the scene of the fire, so that before the flames can have a chance to spread, the chemical solution which will be discharged by the engine will be able to extinguish them. The principle of this machine is on the same basis as the small hand chemical fire extinguishers with which so many buildings are properly provided, and which are even more largely in use on board up-to-date vessels. The engine which it is likely will be purchased by the city will have a capacity of about thirty gallons of chemical fluid, which it will automatically discharge on the flames when brought into use.
