Routine Business At Summerside Council Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last evening with only routine business on the agenda. His Worship Mayor J.P. Arnett presided and there was a full attendance of the Council.

A motion was passed, moved by Councillor W.E. Smallman and seconded by Councillor J.L. Gorrill, that a petition be presented at the next session of the Legislature requesting authorization to issue debentures for an amount not to exceed \$200,000.

DANNY KAYE AT CAPITOL

Another triumph must be chalked up to Danny Kaye. "The Kid from Brooklyn," Samuel Goldwyn's new Technicolor comedy for RKO Radio release which opened yesterday at Capitol Theatre, is a riot of good fun and laughter, and affords the inimitable, versatile comedy star his richest opportunity in a highly spectacular and lavish production.

As Burleigh Sullivan, an offensive and inefficient milkman who wins a world's boxing championship, Kaye pulls out his whole bag of tricks and runs the gamut from slapstick to the most delightful satire. Burleigh gets undeserved credit for knocking out the champion, Speed McFarlane, in a street brawl, and is signed up by Gabby Sloan, Speed's manager, who plans to build him up by a series of phony knockouts and then match him against Speed for the championship in which he will bet his whole bank-roll on the champion. How Burleigh upsets the plan and wins the fight forms the hilarious climax. Nothing like it has even been seen either inside the prize ring or out.

Kaye has the rare knack of making the most preposterous happenings seem convincing. He is, perhaps, at his best in his Pavlova number, truly one of the richest pieces of satire on the ballet ever seen, and which had yesterday's audience helpless with laughter.
