**Man Who Stole From Prince**

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 17—Carlos Tejerina Forthingham, a socially prominent Argentine, whom police accused of stealing Prince George's jewelry when His Royal Highness visited Buenos Ayres in 1931, was sentenced to three years imprisonment today for impersonating another man.

Forthingham was not prosecuted in 1931, because the Prince intervened after his Scotland Yard bodyguard had recovered cuff links, a tie pin, a watch chain and a cigarette case, a gift of the King, which had been stolen from the Prince's bedroom in the British Embassy.

**IN MEMORIAM**

**MR. CHAM AYOTTE**

Mrs. Gaudet, of 29 Valley Street, has received the sad news of the death of Cham Ayotte, 6 Front street, a prominent citizen, who died on Sunday afternoon at the Emerson Hospital, Concord, following an operation for appendicitis. He was 88 years of age, born in Bennington, Vt., and came to Maynard when six years of age. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Margaret Ayotte, his mother, Mrs. Evelyn Ayotte, four children, Regina, Mary, Joseph and Constance, two sisters, Mrs. Libby Emmett of Lawrence, Mrs. Emma King of Providence, three brothers, Samuel and William of Lawrence and Arthur of Maynard.

Mr. Ayotte was well known. He was in the insurance business and was prominent in the town government as a member of the Finance committee of which he was spokesman at town meetings. Mr. Ayotte performed conspicuous public service during his nine years as a member of the Finance committee. He had a thorough grasp of the town finances and was gifted in making plain the financial condition of the town when he spoke for his committee at town meetings.

Mr. Ayotte had the courage of his convictions in the performance of his public duties. When convinced that the welfare of the town required certain action he did not flinch from supporting such a policy though it was not in accord with his own personal wishes nor popular. Mr. Ayotte was well thought of by the townspeople as a man of character and ability, well expressed by his friends who refer to him as "a square shooter, unafraid and on the level."

The news of his passing came as a decided shock to the community. The home was crowded with townspeople who called to pay a last tribute to a young man whom they loved and respected. An abundance of flowers and mass cards mutually evidenced the love and esteem of neighbors, relatives and friends. Mr. Ayotte was affiliated with Maynard Council K. of C. and the Holy Name Society of St. Bridget's church.

The funeral was held Tuesday morning. A requiem mass celebrated at St. Bridget's church at nine o'clock by Rev. James P. Sherry, was attended by a large number of people. Vocal selections were rendered by a quartet composed of Richard Hillyer, James Farrell, Mrs. Joseph Dineen and A. A. Hillyer, organist.

The pall bearers were John Higgins, Thomas King, Arley Lawrence, and Leo Nune. Interment was in St. Bridget's cemetery.

**Action Of "Peg" Exchange Unexpected**

(Canadian Press)

OTTAWA, Aug. 7.—The action of the Winnipeg Grain Exchange in fixing a minimum price for wheat was entirely unexpected here, Government officials stated today. Cables from London declaring that the exchange had acted under pressure from the Canadian Government were referred to members of the ministry who expressed the opinion that the steps taken by the Winnipeg Exchange were due exclusively to the reaction from the Chicago grain pit when restrictive measures there forced United States holders to dump in Winnipeg. No pressure was exerted from Ottawa, officials asserted.


