EMINENT ISLANDERS.

Saturday evening was the date fixed for closing the ballot on the names of Eminent Islanders. The number of ballot papers received was not large, but from the names of the voters who are responsible for them as well as for other reasons we conclude that the result may be acceptable as affording a fair indication of popular sentiment on the subject. Those who sent in ballot papers were necessarily of the class who take an interest in the achievements of our public men past and present. It required their part some thinking to each select just twenty names and arrange them in the order of merit in which each voter thought they ought to be placed, and only one who felt that he had some knowledge of as well as interest in the subject would take the pains to mail a list for publication.

In all something more than a hundred different names were voted for and there were a number of names which received an equal number of votes. In such cases the ties were decided by giving the higher place to the name which came on the average highest in place on the lists received. It ought perhaps to be mentioned that for the nineteenth and twentieth places there were an equal number of votes for Rev. Donald McDonald, Hon. Donald Farquharson, Rev. George Hodgson and Daniel Gordon, and these were decided according to the rule just cited, by which the two first named came within the prescribed twenty and the two worthy gentlemen last named narrowly escaped that distinction.

The list of Eminent Islanders as it appears in another column is a good one embracing as it does names eminent in the state and in the church, in learning, in jurisprudence, in industry, art, journalism and letters. It embraces good names in the Liberal and Conservative ranks, in Protestant and Catholic creeds, and divides the honors between those who are living and those who have passed away. And this is true of almost every list we received thus evincing both candour and a discriminating judgment among those who voted.

Doubtless some will be disappointed to find a favorite name lower down on the list than they had hoped, or perhaps not at all included among the twenty. But it should be remembered that those who are still living may yet achieve eminence, and those who have already attained distinction may hope to rank still higher in the years to come. It is quite possible that a number of those who fall below the line of the twenty may within a few years be able to claim a place high up among the Island's favorite sons.

The Guardian heartily congratulates Sir Louis Davies on his position at the head of the list. It was earned by long and distinguished service at the bar, in the Legislature and in Parliament, in Provincial and Federal Governments, and in dealing with weighty international matters beyond the seas and at Washington. Coles and Whelan have an assured place in the grateful memories of the entire population of this Province. Hon. David Laird was a strong speaker and forceful writer, sat in the Legislature and in Parliament as a Minister, and served a term as Governor in the North West.

The late Hon. J. C. Pope also rendered important services in both the local and federal arena. Archbishop O'Brien was a truly eminent prelate. Dr. Schurman is one of the brainiest men Canada has produced. Chief Justice Sullivan after faithfully service in the political field worthily holds the highest position in our Island judiciary. Sir William McDonald is the foremost captain of industry and the greatest philanthropist the Island has produced. Bishop McEachern as a pioneer prelate of his church fairly won for himself a high place in the regard of all creeds.

Robert Harris is recognized as the most eminent artist the Island has nurtured. His Honor, Lieutenant Governor McKinnon has won that high position at a younger age than any other Canadian Governor, and adorns the exalted station. James Jeffrey Roche has not only a Canadian, but an American fame in letters. Senator Ferguson has served in both provincial and federal Parliaments and Governments, and is one of the best informed public men of Canada.

Governor Howland attained the highest position in this Province, and has linked his name forever with the great Tunnel project. Hon. Fred Peters is one of the ablest lawyers in Canada, and proved himself a highly successful political leader. Judge Hodgson won a foremost position at the bar before he was elevated to the Bench and is today recognized as one of the eminent jurists of the Dominion. Rev. Donald McDonald was in his time one of the most forceful, magnetic and useful of gospel ministers, a man of great brain and a large heart, whose memory is lovingly cherished by thousands. Hon. Donald Farquharson rendered good service in the Legislature and the Government of which he was Premier and afterward in his short term at Ottawa.

Altogether although the list as it appears may not be perfect, it is a list of strong and eminent men, who have made their mark and deserved well of their country. Of course there are others who have rendered almost, and possibly quite equal service to some of these, and we do well to recall their achievements and their worth as an example and a stimulus to the rising generation. All men cannot achieve great fame, but he does well who does what he can for the good of his country and the welfare of his fellow men.

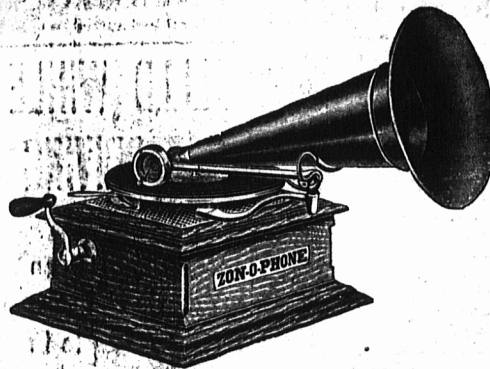
