

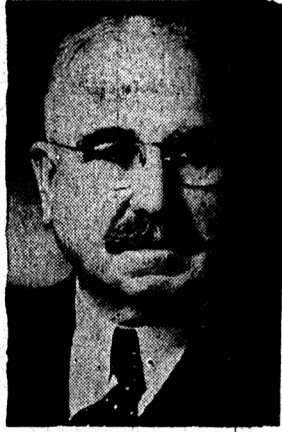

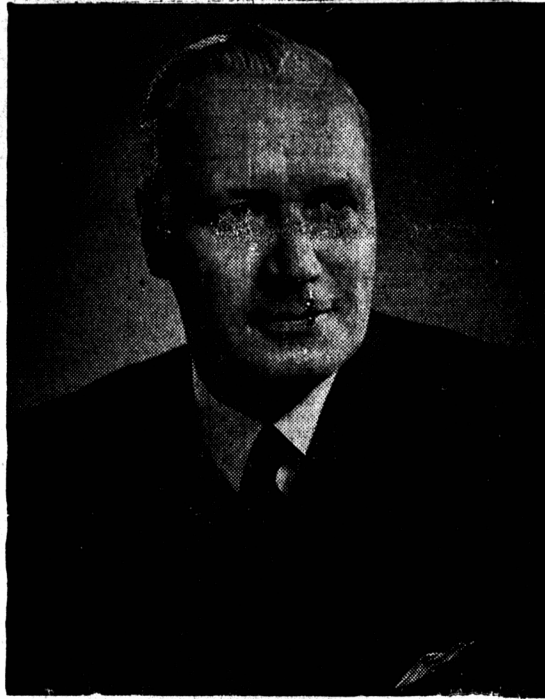

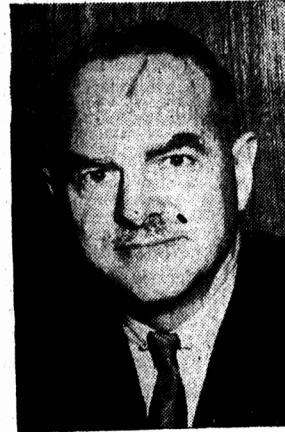

#### 30 Girls Trapped In Store Fire At Glasgow, Scotland

GLASGOW, May 6 — (CP) — Fire today trapped 30 shoppers on the roof of an Argyle Street store and several jumped 50 feet to the ground.

Police said 14 bodies were recovered from the second floor after the roof collapsed.

Scores were injured. Among them were patrons in the nearby movie house.

The flames were brought under control in two hours.

The dead were believed to have been all shoppers working in the store owned by Grafton's, Limited, the largest of Glasgow's downtown department stores.

Two of the dead were girls who leaped from the roof of the four-story building. Most of the other bodies were found huddled together on one of the upper floors.

It was Glasgow's worst fire in 30 years.

Some of the trapped girls were rescued by firemen with ladders. A policeman groped through the smoke to save five.

#### 5 to 10-Year Term For Lye-Ber Death

Sometimes, from current comment, one would almost get the idea that Britain, Canada, and the United States could be forever prosperous just by trading back and forth across the North Atlantic.

Conceivably, but not probably, you could set up Canada and the United States as a self-contained economy which could live unto itself.

Include Britain in, and you must at once forget about building walls around any selected group in this world.

Britain will trade on a worldwide basis, or perish as the Britain she has been.

That is one reason it is not well to condemn lightly the bilateral deals which she has made with various European countries.

If she believed in that sort of trading it would be one thing; but she doesn't; and accordingly it can be hoped that these are short-term measures to achieve an immediate aim.

They can be bad, but if they are merely a means to get European trading rolling, they can result in good.

Canada has had a similar experience. In November, 1947, she put into effect trade restrictions which were against all her trading principles.

For the time being, at least, they have accomplished much of their purpose, and most of them have been removed within a year and a half.
