

FUR TRIMMED BLOUSES

White chiffon and shadow lace make another blouse, with a foundation of flesh colored net or chiffon. There is a very shallow shoulder yoke, to which the back and fronts are slightly gathered. The long sleeves are set under a cording in above a fitted cuff, which is trimmed with a narrow band of white fur and a double ruffling of chiffon. A band of the shadow lace trims the sleeve end, chiffon frilling finishes the round neck, under which is knotted in front.

The opening is bordered in front, side by the lace banding, which is turned in a corner below and continued around the entire waist just above the belt.

White jackrabbit or mouffon will be found best for the fur bands.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Anybody who has a hunter in the family can make a very nice little rug of rabbit skin sewn together on a piece of carpet.

A brass crim tray and scraper are nice for the housekeeper who likes a note of brightness about her dining room furnishings.

If a rug curls, noisier it and wrap it around a broom stick, in the open air for a few days, then tie and let dry.

When boiling cabbage, try placing a small vessel of vinegar on the back of the stove. The odor of the cabbage will not be so unpleasant.

A satisfactory washcloth is made of two or three thickness of mosquito netting. The edges are finished by crocheting a scallop in pink or blue.

If your hair is very oily, try tipping your brush in water and passing it through the hair two or three times a week. This will prevent superfluous oil.

Hominy grits are very good used as a breakfast dish with sausage. Make a gravy with the sausage, and if this is eaten with the grits it will be found delicious.

MEXICAN CROSSBOW SEELKS LIVELIHOOD

EL PASO, Texas, February 4.—His immense income tied up by three years of revolutions, Alberto Terrazas, of the family whose name in Mexico is a synonym for great wealth, has been compelled to seek a means of livelihood.

This information, as astounding in Mexico and along the Rio Grande border as similar news affecting a Rockefeller or a Vanderbilt would be in the United States, became known here today with his departure for Pasadena, California. He was accompanied by his family, but not the usual retinue of servants.

Near Pasadena, Terrazas expects to buy or lease a small farm where he can make a modest living. He is one of those who see no prospect of peace in his native land and until tranquility is restored the income of the vast Terrazas family fortune, estimated at \$35,000,000 to \$40,000,000, in American gold, will be tied up.

Even in the event of peace it may be lost, for the rebels have declared it confiscated.

"I do not mind going to work; it may be a good thing," he said to friends before his departure and then smiled at his own remarks, for his prodigality with money has been a story, chapters of which have been written on two continents.

Terrazas was once governor of the State of Chihuahua, but he never worked for a living. Now, according to himself, he is to labor for his bread and butter.

TELEPHONE COURTESY.
