In the case of McGuigan vs Howatt, City of Charlottetown, garnishee, the garnishee was directed to deduct from the defendant's remuneration as fireman the amount, by which judgment by default was extended. In the case of Poole and Thompson Ltd. vs Ross, C. N. Rwy. Co. garnishee, the garnishee was directed to pay the amount, for which judgment was entered by default, for moneys owed the defendant by the railway. In the case of Callaghan vs Price, absent debtor, judgment was given for the plaintiff for \$122.55 for lumber and sawing done by the latter for the defendant J. A. McDonald for the plaintiff. In the case of Lafferty vs Price, absent debtor, judgment was given for the plaintiff for \$125 for the price of hay sold by the plaintiff to the defendant, J. A. McDonald for the plaintiff. 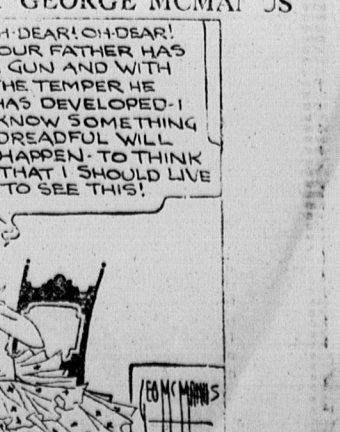

### Art Essential

Says Hon. A. David

MONTREAL, Que., Oct. 27.—"Art is essential to life," asserted Hon. Athanase David, provincial secretary, recently when he opened an exhibition of camera pictures. Dealing with photography he said, he felt of a person, an event, a scene, a personality must of necessity be injected into the picture. In those camera studies before him—all of varied form and impression—there was to be found the touch of two personalities, the vivid and living personality of the sitter or the particular scene, and the personality of the cameraman who, knowing his art thoroughly, brought out all that was of the best in the human pose or lay-out of event or scenery. This was perfect photography," he emphasized.

**GENEROUS ACT OF ADMIRALTY**  
LONDON, Eng., Oct. 28.—After a 4600-mile dash from Beirut, Chief Stoker William Thomas Bennett, of H. M. S. Delhi, reached the bedside of his young wife, who was seriously ill in Middlesex Hospital. The couple were married at Christmas and after a month's honeymoon, Mr. Bennett started a two years' cruise. Mrs. Bennett became gravely ill a month later, and called for her husband night and day. An appeal was made to the Admiralty, who wired instructions to the commandant of the Delhi, with the result that Chief Stoker Bennett was landed in Brazil in time to catch a home-bound French liner.
