## THE CABOT ARRIVES.

The Charlottetown Yacht Cabot, the challenger for the Coronation Cup, arrived in port at 1:30 p.m. yesterday, after a two days' run from Halifax. The yacht came to anchor near the yacht club wharf, where she will remain while she gets in readiness for the first race of the series Saturday next. The yacht came here under a temporary spar, the original one being carried away while on her way from Charlottetown to Hawkesbury. It is understood a new spar is being constructed for the yacht at Hawkesbury. The Cabot resembles the Clou somewhat in appearance, but appears much heavier and not quite as well finished. Her dimensions are as follows: Length over all, 30 feet 10 inches; load water line 25 feet; extreme beam, 8 feet 9 inches; beam at water line, 7 feet 9 inches; free board at bow, 2 feet 4 inches; least free board, 1 foot 8 inches. She is fitted with steel fin, carrying 700 lb. lead ball. Her hull plan, on a small scale, is a copy of the hull plan of the yacht. The underbody is encased in form between the ends. The spars are all hollow and very light. She is double planked, first planking quarter inch, second sixteenth inch. Above the water line she is sheathed and varnished with the best salt water varnish obtainable and her canvas covered deck will also be finished in the same manner. The Cabot was built by Martin Pineau, of Charlottetown, from designs drawn by his son, John Pineau, of this city. She took a spin around the harbor last evening, and from all appearances she will prove a dangerous competitor for the cup, and a very interesting race is expected. Sydney Post Aug 30th.

# RUSSIANS ABANDONED GUNS AND FLED FROM LIAO YANG

## Japs Report a Brilliant Victory—Russians Say They Retired to Better Position, It's the Old Story—Their Own Guns Turned on Retreating Russians—Japanese Losses Under Ten Thousand.

BRILLIANT JAPANESE VICTORY.  
LONDON, Sept. 2.—(Special)—The war news today is still mixed. Japanese advices declare a brilliant victory has been gained at Liao Yang, the Russians being compelled to retreat across the River Tai Tse and leaving their guns in the hands of the Japanese, which they turned on the Russians with good effect.

MORE RUSSIAN STRATEGY!  
The Russians declare the evacuation of Liao Yang is a part of Kuropatkin's plan to get Kuroki's army across the river where the strongest Russian fortifications are, and where a better stand can be made.

JAPS STILL ADVANCING.  
There are no fresh press messages from the front today but the Japanese official reports declare their armies are continuing to

advance and it is believed will severely punish the Russians during their retreat.

THE JAP LOSSES.  
The Japanese casualties in the last few days are less than ten thousand.

[It seems probable that the battle about Liao Yang has resulted in greater disaster to Russia than any previous battle of this remarkable war. When details come to hand we believe this will be established. If the Russians were compelled to abandon their guns there must have been also an enormous sacrifice of war munitions and stores. The Russian excuse for retreat is so stale and flimsy as to confirm rather than discredit the Japanese report of a brilliant Japanese victory. The Japanese losses in several days of severe fighting are less than might have been expected considering the great force engaged.]

## RAILWAY ACCIDENT, 12 KILLED.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 2.—(Special)—On the Canadian Pacific main line Thursday afternoon at Sinitaluta near Indian Head the train with the cars of the vice royal party attached dashed into a freight train head-on.

A dozen are said to have been killed and many injured.
