At the market yesterday pork was quoted 125 to 200 lbs, 5¢ to 300 lbs, 5¢; over 300 lbs, 4¢. Buyers complain that there are too many light, thin, unfinished hogs being marketed. It would be in the interests of the farmers to hold back their hogs and finish them properly. The market outlook is for better prices on good stock, but the small stock and poor hogs will not be worth more than 3c to 4c per pound.

THE Guardian regrets to learn of the death of Mrs. Conroy, aged 77 years, widow of the late Nicholas Conroy and mother of Dr. Conroy of this city. The sad event took place at her home in Tignish yesterday morning. The deceased lady, whose maiden name was Catherine MacDonald, was a niece of the late Bishop McIntyre. In those days when communication between Charlottetown and Tignish was slow and difficult strangers and travellers ever found generous entertainment in her hospitable home. Her memory will be cherished by her children as by many friends who were privileged to know her beautiful Christian character. Her remains will be interred by the side of her husband in the church yard at Tignish and amidst the graves of the friends among whom she passed her life. Eight children survive her, four sons and four daughters, one daughter and one son have preceded her in death. The deceased son was for some time law partner of the present Judge Warburton, under the firm name of Warburton & Conroy. He died in 1888. The late Nicholas Conroy, husband of the deceased lady, after serving for about thirty years in the Legislature, was appointed Registrar of Deeds, which office he held until his death in 1879. He was then 62 years of age.
