SHIPPING HIDES

As a rule, hides are folded so that the hair side is out. It is essential to fold in the head and neck on the body of the hide, flesh surfaces together, and to turn in the tail in a similar manner. The narrow fold on each side should be made by throwing back the body of the hide, flesh surfaces together, keeping the lines of the folds parallel. The legs should then be folded back and these lapped with the hair surfaces together, bringing the break of each fold near the middle line of the back. The side folds should then be completed by bringing together the two breaks of the folds, with the middle line of the back as the main fold. In this way making one long rectangular bundle. The butt end of the folded hide should then be thrown forward about four-fifths of the distance to the neck fold, whereupon the forward portion of the bottom lap should be folded back on top of the first fold, bringing the break of the rear fold even with that of the fold just made.

THE FARM GARDEN.

The farm garden should provide a succession of fresh vegetables and fruit from the time of early asparagus, green peas and strawberries until the time of late cabbage and potatoes, which are stored for winter use.

A fine garden is often neglected when other work in the fields is more urgent, but if the garden is arranged properly some attention can be given that will prevent loss to the garden and not be missed from the field work.

The farm garden should be convenient to the house where those interested may spend some time in weeding and caring for it. The rows should be far enough apart, and as long as the plow allows to permit of horse cultivation, which may be done at odd times when the field work is slack.

A plot 200 x 75 feet will produce supplies enough for an average home with the exception of late potatoes and cabbage, which may be grown in the field with the farm cultivated crops. Some of the garden should include some of the following: Raspberries and strawberries, at least a row of each, and possibly a row of blackberries, gooseberry and currants. Part is a row of rhubarb and one row more of asparagus should be had in this list, which makes permanent section of the garden. The bush fruits are usually planted in rows six feet apart and six feet apart in the row, spheres are allowed to grow in the row, while currants and raspberries are kept in separate bushes. These require an application of manure, preferably on the fall and plowed in, which is a good practice for all the summer cultivation given to keep down weeds and conserve the moisture. Strawberries may be planted three or four feet apart and two feet in the row allowed to make a thick sward. As soon as the plants are up in rows they should be edged with a hoe or hand cultivator. The latter will straddle the row and do both sides at once. The hand cultivator should then be run through the rows every week or after every heavy rain until the tops cover the ground. Thorough persistent cultivation will add greatly to the crop by conserving moisture and by destroying weeds. The plants should be thinned to about ten inches apart in the rows, by the time they get four leaves and hoed a second time before the roots swell. 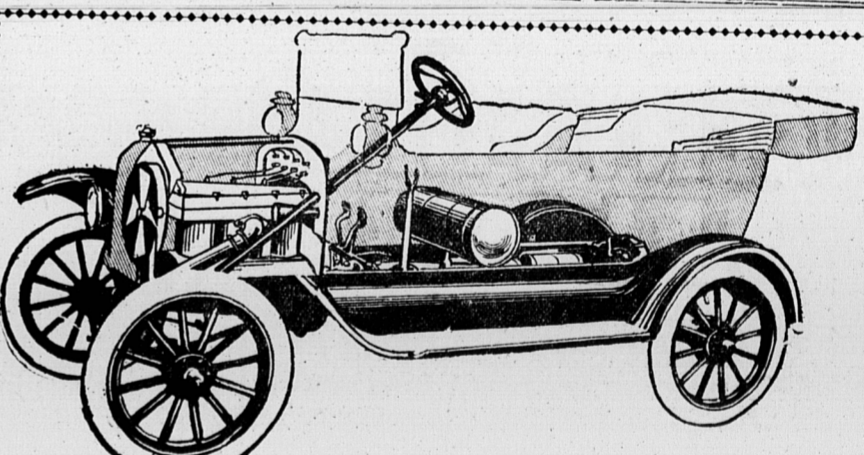
