## NEW PROFESSOR FOR ACADIA

Wibur A. Coit, of Burlington, Vt. Will Join Staff of University in Wolfville

WOLFVILLE, Aug. 5.—Prof. Wibur A. Coit, of Burlington, Vt., has been appointed Professor of Mathematics at Acadia University, Wolfville, and will begin work at the opening of that institution September 30. Prof. Coit is the son of the head Professor of Mathematics in Boston University. He graduated from that institution with high honors in mathematics, and afterwards took his M. A. degree at Harvard, specializing in the same subject. For seven years he has been assistant Professor of Mathematics in the University of Vermont, Burlington, Vt., making a splendid record as a successful instructor. He comes to his new work highly recommended, not only as a teacher, but as a very high type of Christian gentleman. He succeeds Professor R. C. Archibald, Ph. D., who has accepted a position in Brown University.

## THE LEANDERS SUSTAIN STYLE

They Defeat the Belgians Who for Two Years Had Triumphed at Henley.

HENLEY, Aug. 6.—The Leander crew beat the Belgians in the finals of the eight oared race held here today in connection with the international Olympic regatta. The victory of the Leanders to-day over their old rivals, the Belgians, was the occasion of great joy in England and a source of satisfaction to the Argonauts who will know that it took the least crew in the world to beat them and that after the finest race of the regatta.

The Belgians, who defied all rowing traditions by their mode of training, and their style of rowing, won the eight-oared race at Henley 1906 and 1907 and it was expected they would make their third straight victory today after winning from the crack Cambridge crew yesterday. The Leander crew were picked from the best oarsmen in England and their victory will be considered a great triumph for the English style of rowing.

In the finals of the championship single today, H. T. Blackstaffe beat McCulloch one and a quarter lengths in nine minutes and twenty-six sec.

The defeat of McCulloch by Blackstaffe was another surprise for the latter, who had won the diamond sculls this year, and was considered the finest sculler in England. Blackstaffe also competed in the diamonds this year, but was disqualified in his heat by fouling Stuart, whom he defeated by ten lengths. Blackstaffe evidently was the class of the regatta, his time in the final being the best of the week, being twenty-one seconds faster than the heat in which Von Gaza (Germany) beat Lou Scholes. Blackstaffe won easily yesterday from Von Gaza, the German not finishing. Blackstaffe is a veteran having won the Wingfield sculls in 1901, 1903 and 1906. In the last named year he also won the Diamond sculls.

Blackstaffe is a London clerk and has had no university training. He began his rowing career on the river as a member of the Vestas at Putney.

## JAPAN'S NAVY THIRD GREATEST

BERLIN, Aug. 6.—The Japanese navy will take third place in the navies of the world in 1910, according to the fabrication made by the German navy league in its August leaflet just out. Notwithstanding the assertions of Japan's bad financial position, the article says, "the so-called program of 1907 appears to provide for considerably more new construction than has been reported."

From a usually well informed quarter it is affirmed that Japan besides building the three battleships Aki, "A" and "B," and the four armed cruisers Kurama, Ibuli and "E" and "F," has appropriated money for four additional battleships, each of 28,000 tons, and four or five armored cruisers, each of 18,500 tons.

Japan has in actual service fourteen battleships with a total tonnage of 191,400, and twelve large cruisers with a tonnage of 113,000.

## HE SAID "I AM THE EMPEROR"

Mustache Leads Soldier to Fail to Recognize Kaiser

SWINEMUDE, Aug. 6.—Emperor William's new style of wearing his mustache caused His Majesty to be refused admission to one of the coast forts here just before he departed on his trip to Sweden.

The Emperor, accompanied by several officers, the entire party being in civilian dress, approached the entrance to the west battery, where the sentry on duty prevented their further progress.

His Majesty was much amused at the occurrence, and again vainly tried to pass. Then he said to the sentry:—"You must let me enter. Don't you know me? I am the Emperor."

The sentry then looked more closely at the Emperor, not quite reassured, but eventually recognized His Majesty's features as he presented arms and allowed him to pass.

The Emperor reported the occurrence to the officer of the guard at the fort, praising the soldier's sense of duty and recommending his promotion.
