Miss Etta Farquharson, now of High River, Alberta, who was called home by the illness of her mother, Mrs. Donald Farquharson, city, left last night on the mail special on return.

Hon. John Richards, Commissioner of Agriculture, has returned from a short trip to Toronto and Ottawa. While in the latter place he visited the different branches of Agricultural Department and conferred with the officials on matters relating to this Province. He made arrangements for securing speakers to address institute meetings throughout the island beginning this month.

Another of those popular shoots at J. H. Judson's rifle range at Alexandria will take place on Monday next if weather is favourable, and failing this, will be held on Wednesday. The match will be a repetition of the last one, viz: matches will be put on between teams from the North and South sides of the river and also teams from the Fourth Regiment and the Civilian Associations.

The death occurred at Hartsville on Jan. 28th, of Neil McLeod in the 73rd year of his age. The deceased was an honest upright man of a kindly disposition. The respect in which he was held by all the community was evinced by the concourse of people who attended his funeral on Wednesday, the 11th. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, a regular attendant at its prayer meetings at which he took a part. He was married to the second eldest daughter of John Ban MacKenzie of Hartsville, who survives him with four sons and two daughters who are left to mourn.

On the sad mission of attending his mother's funeral, William Houston, of Concord, N. H., passed through the city Saturday evening en route to Fredericton, P. E. I. He will be obliged to wait until today to cross the straits. He said on Saturday that no longer would he oppose Sunday boats and trains. He had always thought they were wrong but his present experience had changed his ideas. Mr. Houston's mother, who had re-married, was about 65 years of age and her death came very suddenly. Her two sons at Concord, N. H., had no news of her illness until a telegram came Friday morning announcing her death. Mr. Houston has been in New Hampshire 16 years and is employed with a large wholesale grocery firm. Fish by this firm and Mr. Houston says the reciprocity agreement will have a tendency to lower prices. "We will be directly interested," said Mr. Houston, "as we get our supply from Gloucester. The fishermen there will make quite a noise for a time, but I think it will come to nothing." Mr. Houston expressed his intention of buying some Canadian machinery for use on a farm which he has purchased. "There is nothing like the Canadian plow," he said. "In Prince Edward Island our plows always turned straight furrows, but in New Hampshire the object seems to be to make them as crooked as possible." Mr. Houston expects to arrive at Fredericton this afternoon in time for his mother's funeral.—St. John Standard.

OTTAWA, Feb. 1.—That Canada has made, since 1900, repeated advances to Australia for a Liberal preferential trade arrangement, but has been unable to get more than excuses for delay, promises of future consideration, or evasions of one kind or another, is shown by a return presented to parliament, giving the correspondence between the Dominion and the Commonwealth.
