### WARRANT ISSUED FOR WERNER HORN

AUGUSTA, Maine, March 6.—A warrant for the arrest of Werner Horn, who tried to destroy the International railroad bridge at Vanceboro on February 2, was issued by United States Commissioner Frank G. Farrington today. The warrant is issued on the indictment of Horn by the Federal grand jury in Boston for the alleged illegal transportation of dynamite in interstate commerce.

It is expected that the arrest will be made in Machias next Sunday, when Horn completes his sentence of thirty days for damaging property on the American side of the boundary. Horn claimed that he was an officer in the German army, and that his attempt to dynamite the bridge was an act of war against Great Britain.
